### **New Services Available**

- Advising: New college advising centers in The College of the Arts, The College of Honors and Exploratory Studies, The College of Humanities and Social Sciences, and The College of the Science and Mathematics now join the already existing college advising centers in the Langdale College of Business Administrative, the Dewar College of Education and Human Services, and the College of Nursing and Health Sciences. Each college now has an advising center director and professional advisors.
- **24/7 Tutoring** is now available through ThinkingStorm. This service is FREE for all VSU students. The link for this company is located in all Blazeview courses, under "Resources."

### **Location Changes**

- While renovations are being completed in West Hall and Odum Library, the following offices
  have moved to Powell Hall East Suite 2230: The President's Office, the Provost's Office, the
  Vice President for Student Success Office, and Institutional Effectiveness. The Office of Legal
  Affairs has moved to Powell Hall West Suite 1100.
- The main entrance to the Odum Library is closed for renovation; patrons should use the entrance facing the Fine Arts Building.

# **Revised or Updated Policies and Procedures**

- Updated Attendance Guidelines: The Faculty Senate has approved updated attendance guidelines. You can see these updated guidelines in our undergraduate online catalog at http://catalog.valdosta.edu/undergraduate/academic-affairs/.
- Updated Process for a Late <u>Medical</u> or <u>Hardship</u> Withdrawal: The withdrawal process and
  policy remains the same except for the following: If a student's medical or hardship appeal is
  validated through the Dean of Students Office, students will receive a "W" for those classes.
  The grade of "WF" will only be assigned in the case of an undergraduate student who has

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exceeded the five withdrawal limit or who has withdrawn to avoid an academic dishonesty penalty.

- Updated Banner Course Designators for Courses Using Low Cost or No Cost Course Materials: In Fall 2018, University System of Georgia (USG) institutions will be required to prominently designate sections of courses whose course materials exclusively consist of no-cost (open or free textbooks) or low-cost course materials at the point of registration. In Banner, USG institutions will use 2 designations for courses with:

No-cost: \$0 required costs

Low-cost: \$40 or under required costs

Excluded from the cost caps are equipment (such as art supplies, calculators, or physical lab materials) and fees for test proctoring. - **Updates to Registration Availability:** Starting this fall, when students are advised for Spring 2019, they will also have the opportunity to be advised for Summer 2019, and registrations for both terms will occur in November 2018. As a result, those faculty scheduled to teach in summer 2019 should also submit their course materials and textbook orders by October 15.
- Licenses & Membership: Professional licenses and memberships must be in VSU's name if state funds are used to purchase. If an organization will not allow institutional membership, please provide the following to Financial Services: documentation from the organization on no institutional memberships and documentation of the benefit of the individual membership to the institution and its mission. Financial Services will then review with Internal Audit on a case by case basis.
- **Non-Overnight Travel:** Effective July 1, 2018, the USG does not provide meal per diem during non-overnight travel due to the IRS taxable compensation implications.
- Employer Provided Clothing/Uniform: Clothing provided to employees is considered taxable compensation per IRS regulations, meaning the employee will be taxed on the fair market value of the clothing/uniform provided. (This is still the case when it is a condition of employment, but the clothes are suitable for taking the place of regular clothing. The general rule of thumb is, clothing is taxable if it is adaptable for every day wear.) At VSU, taxability will be determine at the point of purchase, or in the case of Physical Plant, at the point of hire (assignment of clothing).
- Moving Expenses: Recent federal tax reforms eliminated moving expense deductions beginning January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2025; therefore, moving expenses paid to an employee will be treated as taxable compensation to the employee.

#### **Travel Reminders:**

• If you copy an expense report from a prior year, change the budget reference to 2019 to avoid delayed reimbursements.

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- <u>State Travel Policy</u> section 3.1 prohibits the use of private residence, therefore online private rental services such as Airbnb, VRBO and HomeAway are not allowed.
- Lodging no longer needs to be itemized on the expense report as long as it is itemized on the receipt. Any additional costs included on a lodging receipt such as parking, must be separately listed on the expense report.
- Standing Travel Authorizations within the State of Georgia do not carryover from year to year; please submit approved requests for FY19 if you have not done so already
- Our direct billing account number for Enterprise/National car rental services has been revised
  and is no longer published on our webpage. Please contact Financial Services if you are utilizing
  this service.

Project-based learning is a <a href="high-impact practice">high impact practice</a> (HIP) that asks students to solve problems they recognize as authentic, relevant, and important.

### **Student Affairs Updates**

- The University now has a Death Protocol for student related deaths. This includes notifying key offices, providing support to the campus community and family. The family of the deceased student will receive a Certificate of Achievement or Posthumous Degree as appropriate.
- The Dean of Students provides absentee notifications to faculty when students are absent from class. However, this notification is not an excuse from class, but merely a courtesy to the student. The instructor determines whether to excuse the student from class.

#### • Student Health:

- Hours of operation are Monday-Thursday, 8AM-5:30 PM and Friday, 8AM-3PM;
   students can use our "on call nurse" telephone triage service when we are closed. The phone number is (229) 259.2083.
- For absence verification students can provide the bottom half of their patient statement, indicating the date and time they were seen at the SHC to show proof of visit.
- Faculty and staff can use the telemedicine kiosk in the Health Center and be seen by a physician via telemedicine, insurance is accepted
- Faculty and staff can use the retail pharmacy for prescriptions, as well as purchase over the counter medications
- Flu shots are available to faculty and staff, look for the upcoming email regarding the available dates
