

# ACADEMIC AFFAIRS REORGANIZATIONS

#### **Departments and Programs**

- The Interdisciplinary Studies program is now housed in the Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies in the College of Humanities and Social Sciences.
- The Department of Elementary Education has combined with the Department of Middle Grades, Secondary, Reading and Deaf Education, forming a new Department of Initial Teacher Preparation and Service. Dr. Barbara Radcliffe is serving as the Department Head for the new department.
- The Department of Psychology, Counseling and Family Therapy has split into a new Department of Psychology, housed in the College of Humanities and Social Sciences and a Department of Human Services, which remains in the Dewar College of Education and Human Services and includes Counseling, Marriage and Family Therapy, Educational Psychology and Social Work. Dr. Mark Smith is serving as the interim Head of Psychology, and Dr. Heather Kelley is serving as interim Head of Human Services.

- Core Curriculum Updates
  - In Area D2b, the lecture and lab sections of BIOL 1107K and BIOL 1108K are now divided into two separate courses: BIOL 1107 and BIOL 1107L and BIOL 1108 and BIOL 1108L



- In Area D, MATH 2620 (Statistical Methods) is now MATH 1401 (Introduction to Statistics). Additionally, as a pilot this fall, one section of MATH 1401 is being offered as course in Area A2 without requiring the current pre-requisites.
- MATH 1001 (Quantitative Reasoning) is a new course that will be added to Area A2 in Spring 2020.

## New Services Available

- SmartEvals: VSU now has a new platform for SOIs—SmartEvals. This system was piloted in Spring 2019 and fully implemented during the summer. - APL nextED: APL nextED is VSU's new faculty activity tracking platform. Replacing Digital Measures, faulty will use APL to record their professional activities, upload course syllabi, complete their annual performance evaluations, and more. - **Radius:** Radius, the online application system for graduate programs, to be launched August 2019 for Spring 2020 applicants.
- VSU Day 1: VSU Day1 is a textbook savings program that will provide students with electronic versions of their course materials on the first day of class at a reduced cost. All charges associated with the program will appear on their VSU Student Account, which allows students to easily utilize financial aid to cover the cost if they choose to do so. - AMP: Adult & Military Programs (AMP), located on the first floor of Pound Hall along with the Military Outreach & Veteran Services office, has re-opened to provide support and services to adult learners, active military, transfer students, veterans and military affiliated students. Chris Melody is the Director, Nathan Metzner, the Assistant Director, and Denisha Allen is the Military Outreach and Veteran Education Services (MOVES) Coordinator.

## **Location Changes**

- Aerospace Studies (AFROTC) has returned to Barrow Hall after its recent renovation.
- **Financial Services** has relocated to University Center Entrance #7 in the space formerly occupied by University Advising and Student Transitions.
- The Office of Human Resources and Employee and Organizational Development has now relocated to the former Financial Services Office location. It is still located in University Center Entrance #5 across the hall from its previous location.
- **The Office of Testing** has moved from Powell Hall to University Center Entrance #5, the former location of the Office of Human Resources.
- The College of Arts Advising Center, the College of Science and Mathematics Advising Center, and the Office of First Year Programs have all moved to Converse Hall Suite 3200.

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- The Honors College and Exploratory Advising Center has moved to the Honors House.
- The Office of Communications and Marketing (including Communications and Media Relations, Creative Services, Social and Digital Media, and Marketing and Branding) are all located on the second floor of the Continuing Education Building at 903 N. - Outside Consulting/Employment: The Board of Regents updated its policy on Conflicts of Interest and Conflicts of Commitment. As a result, VSU updated its "Request to Engage in Outside Employment/Activity" form and process. Please note that faculty and staff must now obtain permission before engaging in any outside activity for which there is compensation.

- Employer-Provided Clothing: The value of clothing provided to an employee must generally be included in the employee's taxable income, with some exceptions. The University System of Georgia (USG) recently updated its Business Procedures Manual, section 5.3.17.1.1 Clothing/Uniforms. Clothing items or merchandise credits of \$75 or less cumulative per the calendar year may also be excluded from taxation as a de minimis fringe benefit as long as it is provided no more than two times per the calendar year. For example, an employee that receives two polo shirts with a total value of \$50 will not be taxed on the \$50, but an employee that receives two polo shirts with a total value of \$76 will be taxed on \$76. There must be a specific business purpose for all clothing purchases such as job requirement, safety, etc. and consideration must be given to the fund used to pay for the clothing with fund 10000 being rare to never.
- **Travel Reminder**: If you copy an expense report from a prior year, change the budget reference field to the current fiscal year to avoid delayed reimbursement

#### **Academic Affairs**

• Center for Excellence in Learning & Teaching (CELT): Open Classroom Days for Fall 2019 will occur during the two weeks of Sept. 23-27 and Sept. 30-Oct. 4. This fall, Open Classroom Days will have an "Experiential Learning" theme and include additional campus-wide events, such as a guest speaker who is an expert on experiential learning.

CELT is rolling out VSU's first-ever university-wide Peer Faculty Mentoring Program this fall and plans to run a Faculty Renewal Retreat for post-tenure faculty next summer.

- **Drops Vs. Withdrawals:** As we start a new semester, please remember the difference between a drop and a withdrawal. The add/drop period is generally the first few days of a class. During this period, students may drop or add a class online. If students drop during this period, no record remains of a student having been in the class. Once this period is over, students must withdraw from a class, and a record of their attendance will exist. After the drop/add period is over, student who want to "drop" a class must complete the process by paperwork. The drop form should be reserved for those students who either never attended the class or only attended the first few days. If they have attended, students should be referred to the withdrawal process.
