Items Discussed:

- CORE Curriculum
- 1. Relook at the CORE:
 - Format or organization:
 - Change credit requirements in different AREAS of the CORE: Reduce AREA D to 7 hrs.; reduce AREA E by 1 course; add credit hours to AREA B; add credit hours to AREA C, etc. Eliminated courses could be dropped down to the respective AREA F requirements.
 - Add a new interdisciplinary course to AREA B (Can offer multiple ones with different academic disciplines.) Use the UNDERGRADUATE FOCUS AREAS
 - Arts and Design
 - Education
 - Health Professions
 - Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics
 - Business
 - <u>Exploratory</u>
 - Humanities and Communication Studies
 - Social and Behavioral Services
 - 3. Require CORE faculty to qualify to be a designated Core faculty: Pool of CORE scholars similar to faculty who teach graduate level courses.
 - Content
 - 1. Faculty owns the curriculum.
 - 2. Course should be general enough to be open to all students, regardless of major.
 - 3. Ease in transferring credit to other USG institutions.
 - 4. New initiatives to help with teaching like the CELT Center
 - 2. New Data

- 1. Retention better if freshmen take AREA A (English and Math) their first year of college.
- 2. Algebra should be taken only if the student plans to take Calculus.
- 3. Discouraging Freshman class from taking online classes in their 1st year.
- 4. Retention better if students if they take 2 courses in their intended major in their 1st year delaying completion of CORE classes.
- 5. Issue: growing number of incoming students who have taken CORE classes through dual enrollment programs.
- 3. Look at peer institutions
