Dr. Robert A. Hull, Jr.'s foresight in academia led him to develop and teach undergraduate and graduate courses at Ball State University and Valdosta State University. In addition

to his role as a beloved professor and advisor, Bob was a clinical supervisor, a clinic director, an off campus placement coordinator, and the parliamentarian and executive secretary of the university faculty senate.

His impact on the SLP profession spanned the country through his service to multiple state and national professional organizations, including being a member of GSHA for 23 years. Over time, he held every office in the association, including President for two terms. He also served on several ASHA committees and was the Publications and Technology Chair for the Council of State Association Presidents, an affiliation of ASHA. At the 2009 GSHA annual convention, he was awarded the Honors of the Association in recognition of his outstanding performance in clinical service, academic teaching, service to GSHA, and service to other local, regional, and national organizations.

Dr. Hull will always be remembered for his love for family, VSU, and his students. All proceeds from the Hull Memorial Lecture Series benefit the Dr. Robert A. Hull Scholarship Fund.

#### Julie A.G. Stierwalt is

the Interim Director and Associate Professor in the School of Communication Science and Disorders at Florida State University, where she teaches courses in dysphagia, neurogenic cognitive/

communication disorders, structural-based communication disorders, and medical speech pathology. Dr. Stierwalt received her B.A. and M.A. degrees from the University of Northern Iowa, and her Ph.D. from the University of Iowa.

Currently her clinical work centers on evaluating and treating clients in the L.L. Schendel Speech and Hearing Clinic at Florida State University, consulting with community agencies, and clinical research in dysphagia, motor speech disorders, and cognitive-linguistic impairment. She has co-authored a textbook and published numerous articles and chapters in the areas of neurogenics and dysphagia. She became the Editor of Contemporary Issues in Communication Science and Disorders in 2010. Dr. Stierwalt is active in ASHA. serving numerous times on the ASHA Convention Program Committee as Topic Chair and Reviewer in the areas of Adult Language, Motor Speech, and Dysphagia. In 2009, she was awarded ASHA Fellow status. Dr. Stierwalt is also a strong advocate for students, serving as a Consultant on the Executive Council for NSSLHA since 2005.
