^{*}Health Insurance: All foreign students must purchase the VSU comprehensive medical insurance policy for the duration of their enrollment. Although the VSU Health Center provides free routine medical care for all university students, this insurance is necessary to cover the high cost of hospitalization and emergency medical treatment, including medical evacuation and repatriation. Amounts reflected on this form are (single) students; students with dependents will be subject to different fees.
