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Introduction

This report is a summary of the perceptions of two groups of Valdosta State University (VSU) Alumni—those who graduated one year ago, and those who graduated five years ago. The group from one year ago graduated in Fall 2010, Spring 2011, or Summer 2011, while the group from five years ago graduated in Fall 2006, Spring 2007, or Summer 2007.

In academic year 2010-2011 (one year ago), 1,660 students graduated. In academic year 2006-2007 (five years ago), there were 1,448 graduates. Surveys were sent to 1,348 graduates from one year ago and to 1,029 graduates from five years ago, based on the address on file with the Office of Alumni Relations. The response rate is 6.3% for the group from one year ago, and 5.0% for the group from five years ago. The total response rate was 5.7%.

This survey was last conducted in 2010, surveying the populations from academic year 2007-2008 and academic year 2003-2004. The 2010 survey saw response rates of 8.1% for the one year out group and 8.3% for the five years out group.

Summary

VSU received 85 surveys out of the 1,348 sent to graduates from academic year 2010-2011 (one year ago). Of these respondents:

- 21.2% have enrolled in a graduate or professional program
- 58.8% are employed full time
- 57.4% are currently making between \$20,001 and \$40,000 annually
- 61.2% feel Valdosta State University's academic reputation is improving
- 58.8% would choose Valdosta State University again
- 84.4% would recommend Valdosta State University to others
- 90.6% are proud to be a Valdosta State University graduate


Additionally, the University received 51 surveys out of the 1,029 sent to graduates from academic year 2006-2007 (five years ago). Of these respondents:

- 52.0% have enrolled in a graduate or professional program
- 84.0% are employed full time
- 38.3% are currently making between \$20,001 and \$40,000 annually
- 69.4% feel Valdosta State University's academic reputation is improving
- 64.7% would choose Valdosta State University again
- 92.2% would recommend Valdosta State University to others
- 94.0% are proud to be a Valdosta State University graduate

Respondent Demographics


Respondents were asked to provide some basic demographic data at the end of the survey. Race and Ethnicity are reported according to Federal Definitions, where anyone self-reporting more than one race is classified as "multiracial," and anyone self-reporting as Hispanic is classified as "Hispanic," regardless of other races reported.

Respondents by Gender





Undergraduate Experience at VSU



Level of Preparation upon Graduation






Level of Preparation upon Graduation (continued)




Question 2—How would you rate the overall effectiveness of your program/major?




Question 3—Rate your satisfaction with the following aspects of your education at VSU:

1 = Very Unsatisfied, 2 = Somewhat Unsatisfied, 3 = Somewhat Satisfied, 4 = Very Satisfied




Question 4—How important is it to you for VSU to emphasize the following?

Graduate Study


Respondents were asked whether or not they have pursued a graduate degree since graduation, as well as their level of preparation for the work in graduate or professional school.




Respondents were asked several basic questions about their current employment situation, as well as questions about their level of preparation for professional practice.

Question 8—How long did it take to obtain your first full-time permanent job after graduation?




Question 9—Did you relocate for your first job after graduation?


Question 11—What is your current field of employment?



Question 12—Is your current employment directly related to your major?



Question 13—What is your annual full-time salary?







Overall Impression of VSU



Question 16—In your opinion, is VSU's academic reputation:




Question 17—Given your investment of time and effort, rate the value of your education.




Question 18—If you started college again, would you choose to attend VSU?






Question 20—Are you proud to be a VSU graduate?




Question 21—How connected do you feel to VSU as an alumnus?






Question 24—If you read the VSU Alumni Voice, what type of articles do you most enjoy?




Question 25—Have you visited the VSU campus since you graduated?
