### **Valdosta State University's History**

Founded in 1906 as South Georgia State Normal College; opened to "young ladies" on January 2, 1913, and offered two years of college work; 1922 name changed to Georgia State Woman's College at Valdosta; went coeducational in 1950 and changed the name to Valdosta State College; in 1993 the College was elevated to Regional University status and became Valdosta State University.

### **About Valdosta & Lowndes County**

- Valdosta, the county seat of Lowndes County, is Georgia's 10<sup>th</sup> largest municipality, with a population of approximately 50,000. Lowndes County has approximately 110,000.
- Valdosta, located at the Florida border, has a mild climate.
- Valdosta is just 4 hours from Atlanta and Orlando.
- Moody Air Force Base, home of the 347<sup>th</sup> Rescue Wing, is located in Lowndes County.
- Lowndes County's Wild Adventures is Georgia's newest theme park located 4 miles south of I-75 at Exit 13. Wild animals, rides and shows are all features at this 170 acre park.
