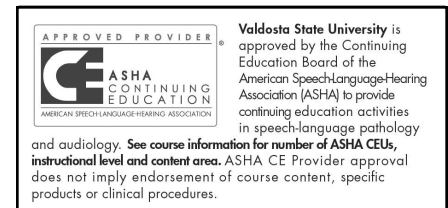

In 1969, Dr. Robert A. Hull, Jr. graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree from Clarion University. Upon completion of his master's degree from Clarion, He

began his career by developing many of the courses taught at Ball State University and Valdosta State University. His foresight into academia led him to develop and teach specific courses on both the undergraduate and graduate levels. In addition to his role as a professor and advisor, Bob also was a clinical supervisor, a clinic director, an off campus placement coordinator, the parliamentarian and executive secretary of the university faculty senate.

His impact on the profession spanned the country through his service to multiple state and national professional organizations including a member of GSHA for 23 years, holding every office in the association for 22 years, President for 2 terms, and Ad-Hoc chair of the Directory Committee which lead to the publication of GSHA's first membership directory. He also served as the Publications and Technology Chair for the Council of State Association Presidents, an affiliation of ASHA, and on several ASHA committees. At the 2009 GSHA annual convention, he was awarded the Honors of the Association in recognition of his outstanding performance in clinical service, academic teaching, service to GHSA, and service to local, regional, and national organizations.

About the Presenter



Lollie Vaughan, Ph.D.,

Dr. Lollie Vaughan completed her undergraduate degree in Speech & Hearing Sciences at the University of Southern Mississippi, her Masters degree in Communication Sciences & Disorders at Texas Christian University, and her doctorate degree in Hearing, Speech, and Language Sciences at Ohio University.

Dr. Vaughan worked clinically in the acute medical setting, primarily with contract work, at an area federal women's prison hospital. Since completing her doctorate, her clinical work at the University of Mississippi has been in the assisted living and university clinic setting with patients with aphasia, apraxia of speech, and dementia.

Her research has focused on treatment approaches for apraxia of speech and concomitant balance and hearing disorders in the elderly with cognitive defects.

Summary of Presentation

This course will familiarize professionals with recent findings to facilitate accurate differential diagnosis of various forms of dementia. This course will also review effective treatment techniques for patients with dementia and their caregivers. Participants will have opportunities to practice these techniques during the session. The course will be interactive and will utilize small group problem-solving and case-based assessments.
