Minor in Psychology

A minor in psychology can be an excellent academic supplement to many majors at VSU or if a student wants to apply to graduate school in psychology without completing a psychology undergraduate degree. Please contact the department for assistance in selecting courses appropriate for your needs. In addition to successful completion of PSYC 2500, fifteen (15) hours of coursework selected from the following courses constitutes a minor (see below). PSYC 2500 must be completed with a grade of "C" or better before any courses in the minor can be taken and a grade of "C" or better must be earned in each course in the minor. 1. Choose ***one course*** from the following: 3 Hours

*PSYC 3200: Child Psychology
PSYC 3210: Adolescent and Young Adult Psychology
PSYC 3220: Adult Psychology and Aging

2. Choose ***one course*** from the following: 3 Hours

*PSYC 3400: Abnormal Psychology
PSYC 3450: Theories of Personality

3. Choose ***one course*** from the following: 3 Hours

PSYC 3300: Applied Behavioral Analysis I
*PSYC 3500: Statistical Methods in Psychology
(Prerequisite: MATH 1111 with a grade of "C" or better)

4. Choose ***two courses*** from the following: 6 Hours

*PSYC 3600: Experimental Psychology
(Prerequisite: PSYC 3500)
PSYC 3700: Rehabilitation Psychology
PSYC 3710: Social Psychology
PSYC 3800: Industrial/Organizational Psychology
PSYC 4300: Applied Behavioral Analysis II
(Prerequisite: PSYC 3300)

****Minimum*** number of suggested courses if you plan to attend graduate school in psychology without completing a psychology undergraduate degree. Check with the Department's graduate admissions committee for the specifics of a particular graduate degree, proper advising, and any additional requirements for graduate study.
