- Purpose: facilitates communication and enables exchange of information about our collections and ideas promoting their continued preservation


Georgia Herbarium (Consortium) Alliance

- Meeting sponsored by Wendy Zomlefer, Univ of Georgia Herbarium, funded by her CSBR NSF grant

Challenges of small collections

- Teaching load
- Isolation
- Inadequate financial resources
- Inadequate IT support
- Lack of curatorial expertise
- Lack of digitization expertise
- Inadequate understanding among colleagues and administrators of the value of biological collections in scientific research
