- Julie Lee gave an overview of the October NCATE & PSC accreditation visit. The general time schedule of the visit was also discussed.
- A LiveText visitor's pass, 3E686CA7, was developed for the COE Assessment Committee members to access assessment committee

information. The COE Assessment Committee members will be able to view COE Assessment Committee agenda, minutes, recommendations, etc.

- The COE candidate data for spring and summer were presented. The COE Assessment Committee members had a group discussion and gave feedback. The discussions included the self-assessment dispositions. There were suggestions of possible ways to present item 11.
 - Statement 11: The most important variables that influence the impact of my performance as an educator are the students' family backgrounds and the students' personal motivation.
 - Dr. Polly Diamond suggested: The student's personal motivation and family background have more to do with student achievement than what I do as a teacher.
 - The COE Assessment Committee recommended field testing this item in the next administration.

- The Decision Point Assessments were discussed.
 - The COE Assessment Committee recommended the COE Observation Instrument evaluation information not be used as a decision point until all supervisors are trained; use of the instrument will be revisited at that time.
