### **B.S.Ed. in Special Education: Deaf and Hard of Hearing**



Valdosta State University offers a Bachelor of Science in Special Education-Deaf and Hard of Hearing (B.S.Ed.) program of study at the undergraduate level that prepares pre-service teachers to work with students who are D/deaf or hard of hearing. By providing students with content knowledge and pedagogical skills, students graduate prepared to meet the diverse needs of this unique student population. This pre-professional degree (P-12) is designed to provide graduates with competency in American Sign Language (ASL), as measured by a Level 2 on the American Sign Language Proficiency Interview (ASLPI). This equips graduates with the skill set needed to communicate with students enrolled in schools for the deaf, as well as those served in resource rooms and general education settings. During the last semester of their senior year students apply to the Graduate School for admission in the Master of Education-Deaf and Hard of Hearing (M.Ed. - 5-year) program. This 5-year program culminates with a M.Ed. Students who successfully completed the M.Ed. are recommended to PSC for certification.

### M.Ed. in Deaf and Hard of Hearing Education (5TH YEAR PROGRAM)

The Department of Initial Teacher Preparation and Service offers a 5th year Master of Education (M.Ed.) program for students graduating from the VSU Undergraduate Program of the same name. Valdosta State University students with a B.S.Ed. pre-professional degree in deaf and hard-of-hearing have the option to do a fifth year master's program to earn initial certification. Majors in special education/deaf education demonstrate content knowledge through passing the state required content assessment in deaf education. Students in this graduate program will demonstrate skills in assessment, instructional strategies, use of technology and monitoring/modifying instruction during observed teaching episodes evaluated by a university supervisor and P-12 mentor teacher.

### **ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS**

- Bachelor's degree in Deaf Education from Valdosta State University.
- Cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher. Submission of all transcripts.
- GRE score of not less than 800 on verbal and quantitative combined (minimum of 400 on verbal) and 3.0 on analytical writing or Minimum MAT requirement of 375.
