#### Competencies:

Develop basic knowledge of pedagogical methods and materials related to individual and group instruction in voice. Provide opportunities for students to observe and apply newly acquired knowledge and skills in a variety of teaching situations. **DOM: Candidates will employ fundamental music pedagogy appropriate for their instrument or voice.** 

## **Objectives:**

Introduce undergraduate voice majors to basic concepts and methodologies of modern vocal pedagogy and voice science.

This course is designed as a comprehensive overview for prospective voice teachers, choir directors and performers

Provide students with a basic understanding of the Art of Teaching Singing, including an introduction to basic anatomy and physiology of the singing voice

Help students acquire the knowledge, tools, and skills necessary to teach voice effectively

Increase awareness of pedagogical writings from various sources that could impact your teaching

Familiarize the student with common laboratory tools available for research on the singing voice

Develop a solid foundation for continued learning in the theories and methods of vocal pedagogy

Learning outcomes:

The student will demonstrate basic knowledge and understanding for organizing and conducting instruction for the cultivated singing voice. Students will begin to understand the psychology of teaching singing and the interrelationship between Artistry and Technique.

## Course requirements and Assessment:

Homework/Chapter Quizzes 25 %

Vocal pedagogy notebook 25%

- a. keep a journal of lessons/lesson plans (2 lessons total) with your student(s), Include vocal exercises used, specific problems addressed, progress made in lessons, literature assigned and lesson plans
- b. Review/critique 4 peer reviewed articles from a scholarly journals of singing/voice science (presented in class)
- c. Class notes/handouts
- d. Make a video recording of a 15 minute of an additional voice lesson for evaluation
- e. In Class presentations -Vocal warm ups, other assigned journal articles/text book reviews...
- f. Song /aria analysis: please select three Italian arias/songs and three Art/folk songs in English from the standard repertoire for that would be appropriate for prospective entry level voice majors (one male and one female student). Discuss/describe the technical challenges of each piece (registration, phrasing, articulation, legato line...)
- g. Observe and evaluate voice instruction in a group or solo setting

Midterm 25%, Final Exam 25%
