* **SCHOLARSHIPS:** Scholarships waiving the non-resident portion of the tuition are available for outstanding undergraduate and graduate students. Students with scholarships follow the "Georgia Resident" fee schedule. A student seeking a scholarship should request a scholarship application. In addition to this scholarship, some graduate assistantships are available. Off-campus employment is generally not available. No full scholarships are available.

****INSURANCE:** All foreign students must purchase the VSU comprehensive medical insurance policy for the duration of their enrollment. Although the VSU Health Center provides free routine medical care for all university students, this insurance is necessary to cover the high cost of hospitalization and emergency medical treatment, including medical evacuation and repatriation.
