

The 852 for URL Holdings

This section is intended to illustrate how libraries may choose to utilize the 852 call number field and subfields in the holdings record for URLs.

- **\$b - Sublocation or Collection**

The *Sublocation or Collection* is used in all holdings to display the **Location:** text in public OPACs. There are two types of *Location Codes* libraries may choose to use to generate these displays:

- **Exclude Location Code** - a location code used for excluding holdings in the Universal Catalog. Examples of resources using the Exclude location are JSTOR, SFX, and so on.
- **Unrestricted Access Location Code** - used by libraries to indicate the resource has unrestricted access by any user. Examples of unrestricted resources are URLs for G.P.O. resources, Georgia Documents in GALILEO, and any other Website providing free access.

- **\$h - Classification and \$i - item (cutter)**

When performing a call number search, Voyager searches the holdings record to retrieve records. Libraries wishing to retrieve electronic records when performing this search will want to include the call number in the holdings. An example of this are shown below:

Note the (Online) at the end of the cutter helps distinguish it from other versions in a results list.

Libraries may also choose to omit the call number altogether.

- **\$z - Public Note**

Libraries may want to indicate to patrons that the resource is restricted to authorized users.

The *Call Number* OPAC display label can be turned off for these resources when not present.
