What are persistent links?



A persistent link, also known as a durable, stable, or permanent link, is an Internet address (**URL - Uniform Resource Locator**) that connects directly to a specific full-text article in a library database or electronic journal subscription.

It is labeled as a "persistent link" and (Permalink).

Finding the persistent link for an article is the first step.



Different databases do varied things with persistent links. Finding the persistent link in a record can be tricky, as it may be found in different places and called different things from database to database. Be on the lookout for one of these action terms “BOOKMARK, SAVE, COPY, or CAPTURE” as paired with one or more of the following link descriptors, “PERMALINK, PERSISTENT, DURABLE, or STABLE.



Sometimes e-mailing the citation to yourself is a good way to obtain a persistent link.



Then too, remember you can always “Ask a Librarian” – [Live Chat](#), whenever you need help with persistent links or have other library resource questions.



The next step, is to make sure that the persistent link will be accessible from off-campus at home or in the office at work (to VSU students, staff, and faculty.)



The [Anywhere Access Tool for Persistent Links](#) is an easy off-campus link generator found on the Library's web site.

Using the provided tool to add “Anywhere Access” to persistent links involves three simple steps.

1 – 2 – 3
EASY

1. Copy (CTRL-C) ,
2. Paste (CTRL-V) and
3. Press the “Create Link” button.

New Enhanced Anywhere Access Link:

The Anywhere Access Tool **WILL NOT** allow the general public to access articles via links.

Persistent links made with the Anywhere Access Tool will only work for VSU students, faculty, and staff.

So the last step is to USE the Anywhere Access Persistent Link.

1. Double-click (or triple-click) the text box above to select the persistent link.
2. (Use Ctrl-C) to copy the new enhanced Anywhere Access link.
3. (Use Ctrl-V) to paste the new enhanced Anywhere Access persistent link into your document or browser.
4. E-mail tip: Use TinyURL or other favorite link reduction service to shrink the link .

Instructors can make good use of persistent links in their online courses by linking directly to assigned readings.

Why would you want to link to VSU Library articles owned? In a word, "copyright!" Completion of the University System of Georgia (USG) Copyright [Fair Use Checklist](#)* is not required when submitting **VSU licensed** persistent links for library electronic reserves or in BlazeVIEW.

Important note: Persistent links found in databases and put through the Anywhere Access Tool will only be accessible by VSU students, staff and faculty. When off-campus, a properly constructed persistent link will lead to the Library's Anywhere Access login screen, where the user will need to enter their VSU e-mail account name and password. When accessing BlazeView from off-campus, students will need to enter their account name and password a **second time**.
