

## MLA CITATION GUIDE

*When using the MLA style manual, 1.) entries are to be alphabetized by author 2.) when there is not an author, entries are to be alphabetized by the title 3.) for citations running longer than one line, remember to indent and double space subsequent lines.*

### PRINT FORMAT

#### Basic Book Entry

Author's last name, First name. Title of the book: with subtitle if there is one. Place of Publication: Publisher, year of publication.

#### **Reference book & Multivolume work example (MLA-5.6.8, 5.6.15)**

Piper, Paul S. "Research on the Internet." The Internet Encyclopedia. Ed. Hossein Bidgoli. Vol. 3. Hoboken, NJ: John Wiley & Sons, 2004.

#### Basic Scholarly Journal Entry (pages of volume numbered continuously)

Author's last name, First name. "Title of the article: with subtitle if there is one." Journal Title Volume number (year of publication): page-numbers.

**Basic Internet Site Entry**

Author's last name, First name. "Title of the document." Information about the print

publication. Information about the electronic publication. Access information.

### Basic GALILEO Entry for Full Text Articles

Author's last name, first name. "Title of the article: with subtitle if there is one." Journal Title Volume number (Date of the article): page numbers. Name of the Database Used. Name of the Subscription Service. Name of the library or library system with the city, and state abbreviation. date of access of the full text article <URL of the service's main web page>.
