

**SPRING 2008 SEMESTER
COURSES APPLICABLE TO NEW STUDENTS**

To prevent registration delays, make sure your advisor has approved **all** your courses in advance. As a new student, you should check the **co-requisites** for courses in which you are interested. Courses with MLIS 7000 as a co-requisite can be taken simultaneously with MLIS 7000. If you need to obtain **consent from an instructor** to take a course, it must be discussed with your advisor first. If your advisor agrees, you must then contact the instructor. You will *not* be able to register for such a course until the instructor informs the Registrar to give you an override.

CORE COURSES

Taught every year – the aim is to have core courses taught two terms within each academic year.

MLIS 7000 Foundations

All new students must enroll in MLIS 7000 their first semester in the program.

MLIS 7100 Information Sources and Services

Pre-requisite or co-requisite: MLIS 7000

A requisite for the Reference Track.

MLIS 7300 Cataloging and Classification

Pre-requisite or co-requisite: MLIS 7000

A requisite for the Cataloging and Classification Track.

ELECTIVE COURSES

In general, electives are taught every two years.

MLIS 7110 Online Searching

Pre-requisite or co-requisite: MLIS 7000

Qualifies as one of the three electives for the Reference Track.

MLIS 7370 Information Architecture

Pre-requisite or co-requisite: MLIS 7000 or consent of the instructor

A requisite for the Technology Track.

MLIS 7500 Microcomputer Applications

NO Pre-requisite

Qualifies as one of the four electives for the Technology Track

Recommended for students needing a basic foundation in computing concepts.

MLIS 7580 Digital Libraries

Pre-requisite or co-requisite: MLIS 7000 or consent of the instructor

Qualifies as one of the four electives for the Technology Track.

Recommended for students interested in Archives.

MLIS 7710 Archival Theory and Issues

Pre-requisite or co-requisite: MLIS 7000

Hybrid format (part online, part in-person). See the description at

Highly recommended for students seeking expertise in Archives.

MLIS 7999 Multicultural Youth Literature

NO pre-requisite.

Potential elective for the Youth Services Track under development.

COURSES NOT APPLICABLE TO NEW STUDENTS:

MLIS 7800 Capstone

Applies to students entering their last semester of the MLIS program.

MLIS 7950 Independent Study

Applies only to a study plan that is **not** covered in courses in the curriculum.

Must be arranged in advance with your advisor.

MLIS 7960 Supervised Fieldwork

Recommended for a later semester in your course of studies.

Required for the Cataloging & Classification Track and the Reference Track.

Must be arranged by mutual agreement among you, your advisor, and a site supervisor.
