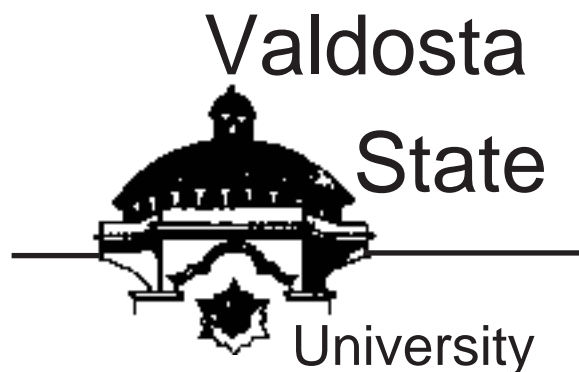

- ◆ Enrollment for fall semester 2000 was 8,820, which was a .74 percent increase over fall semester 1999.
 - ◆ New students totaled 2,233 in Fall of 2000 which was an 8.5 percent increase from 1999.
 - ◆ The average age of undergraduates is 23, and graduate students average 34 years of age.
 - ◆ The student body is a diverse group. Females represent the majority of the student body at sixty-three percent. Twenty-five percent of the students are self-declared minorities.
 - ◆ Georgians comprise eighty-eight percent of the total enrollment, Floridians account for four percent, and International students represent two percent.
 - ◆ Students come from 146 of the 159 counties in the state, 49 states, 1 U.S. territory, and many countries.
 - ◆ In FY 2001, over \$41 million in student financial aid was distributed.

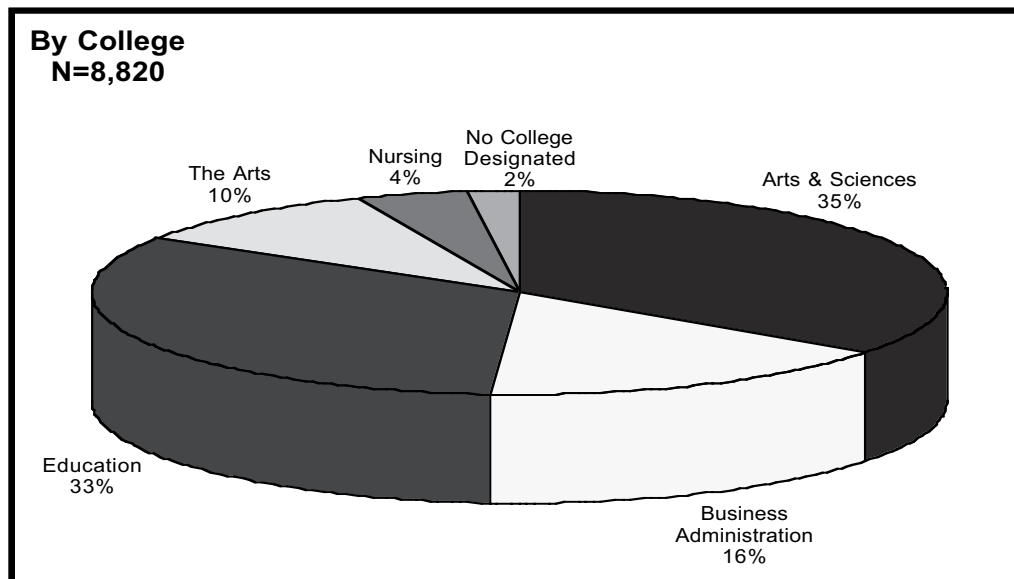
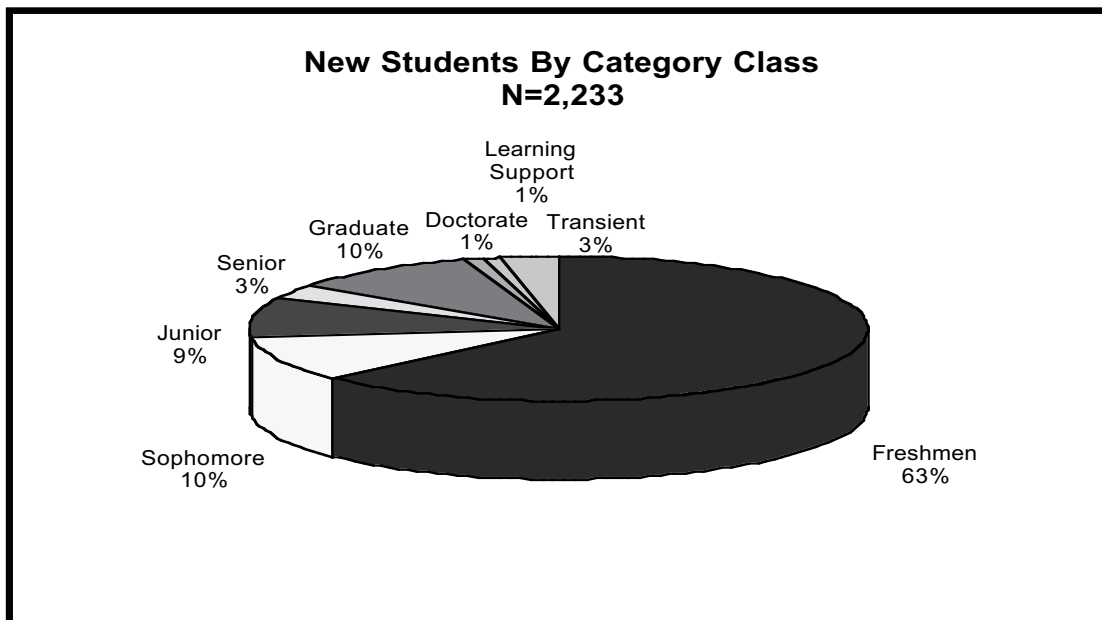
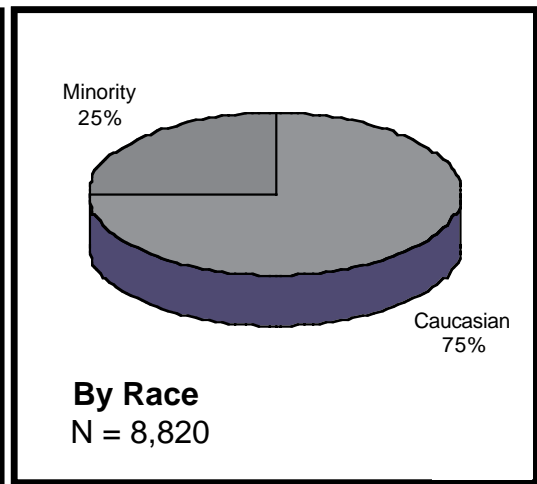
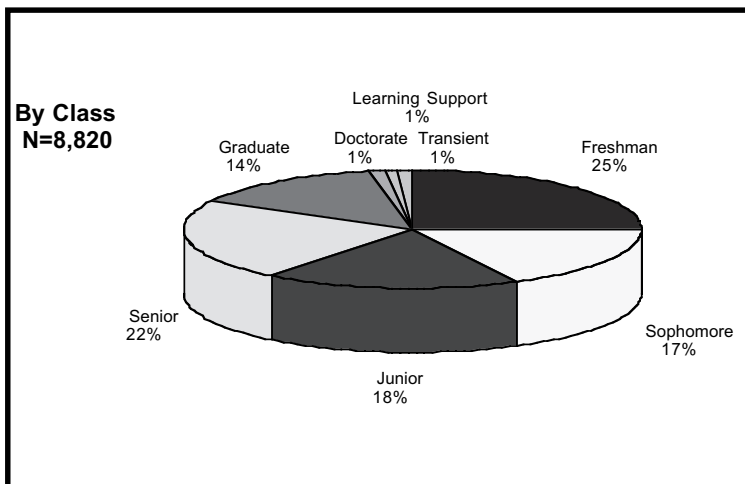

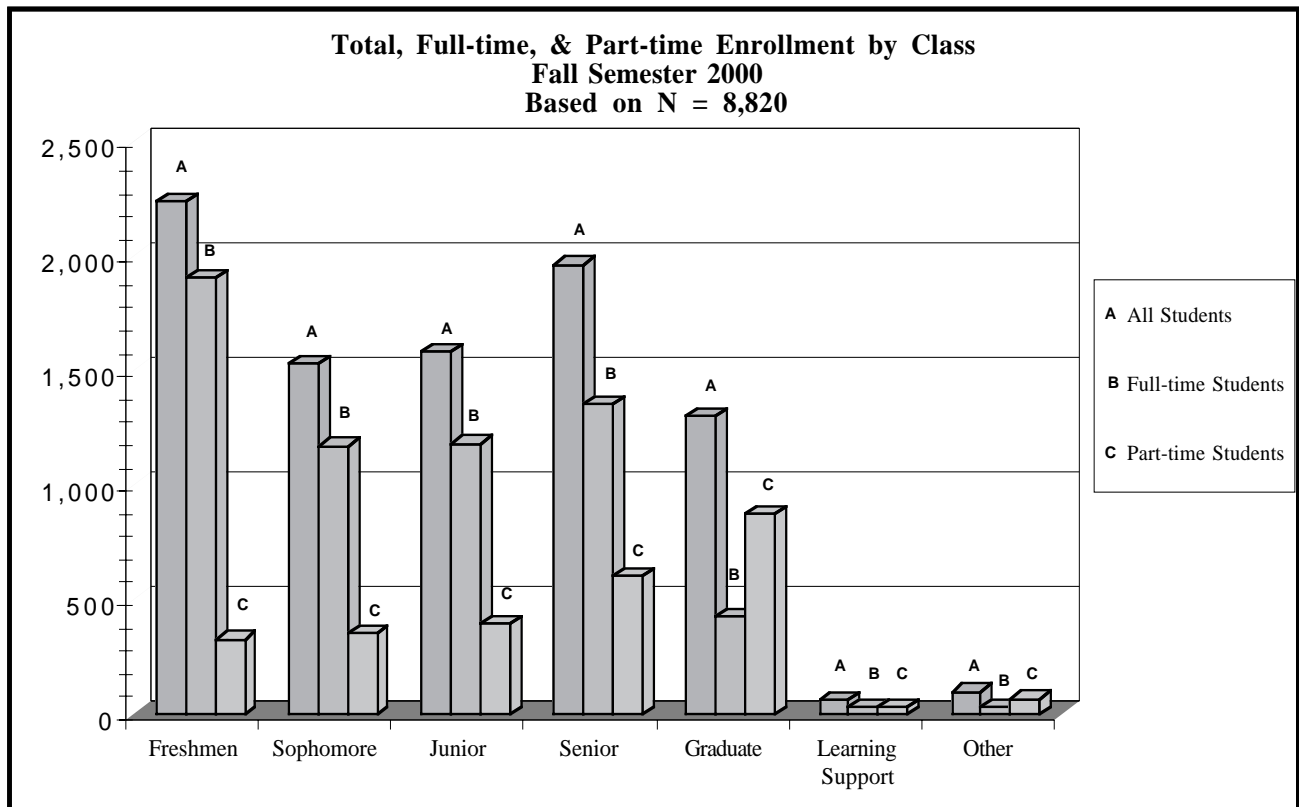

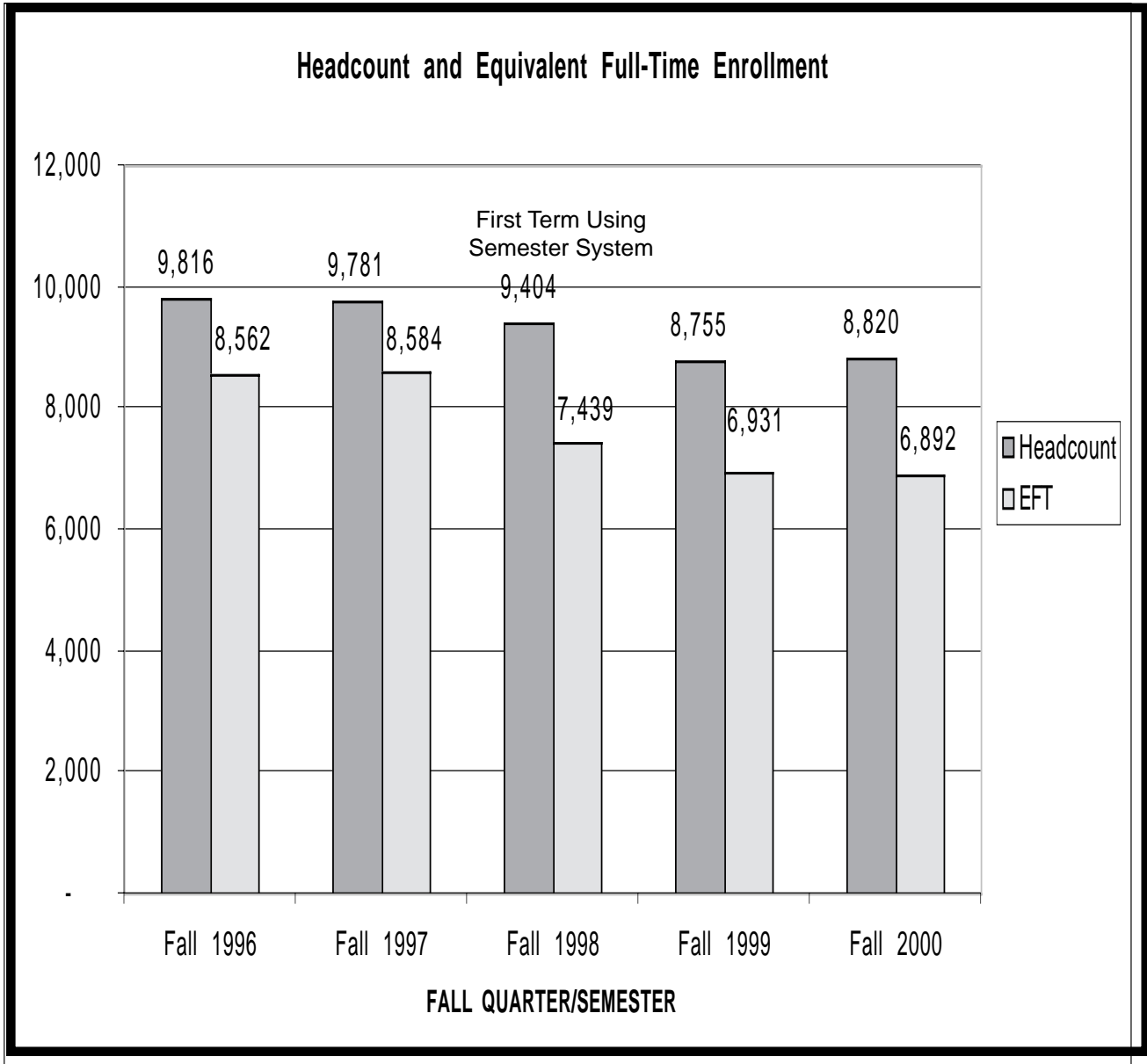

ENROLLMENT BY GEORGIA COUNTIES - FALL SEMESTER 2000

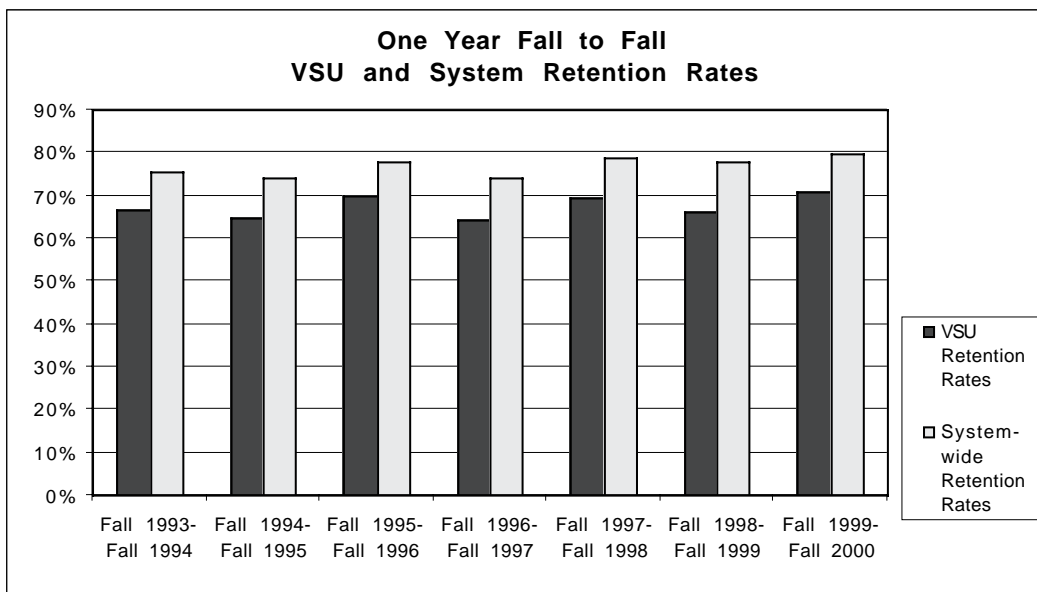

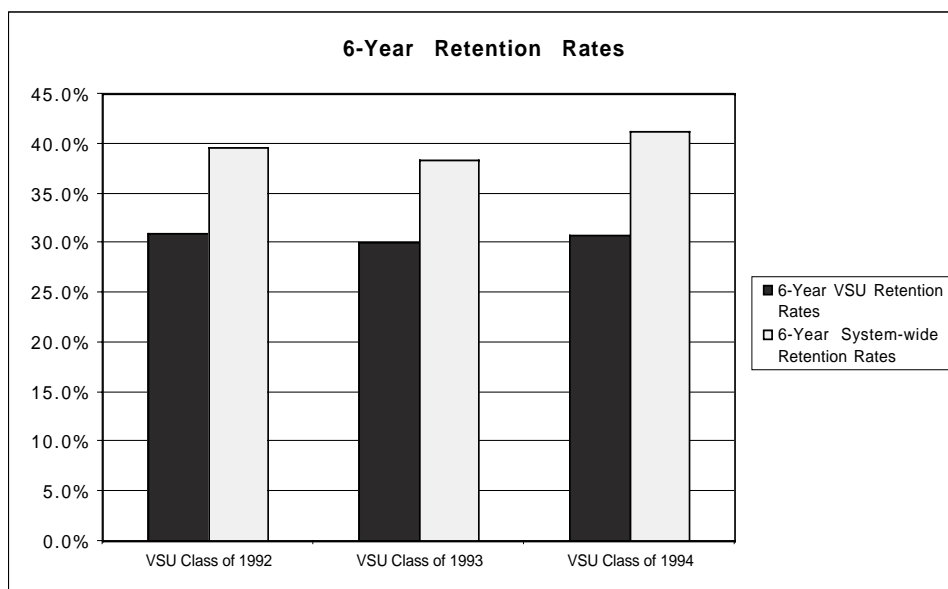
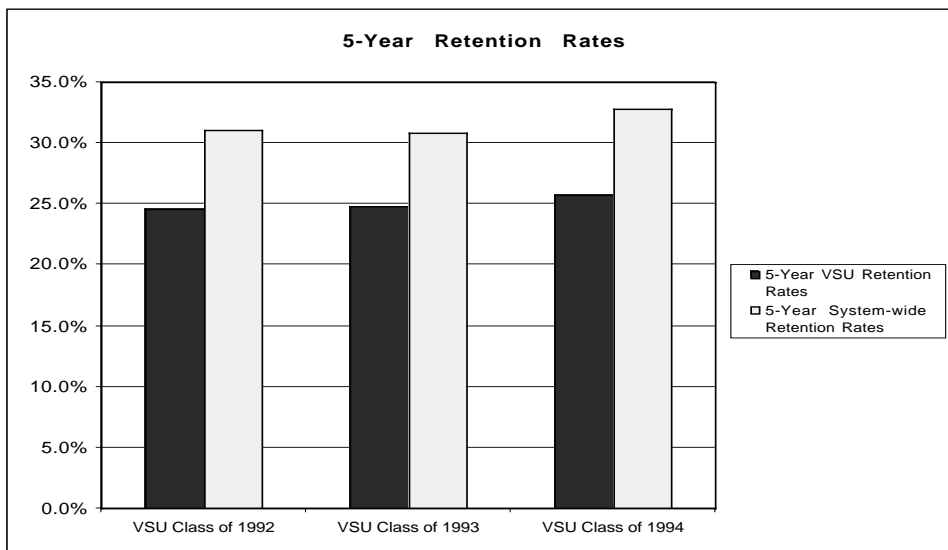
