This year we raised a total of \$115,567.00 for philanthropic causes and performed more than 8,630 hours of community

service! Not only does our community achieve excellence in community service, we are also above the all student grade point average. Currently, the all sorority average is 3.06 and the all Greek average is a 2.91. In addition, Strategic Research and Analysis reports that the 4-year retention and graduation rates for Greek students are 14% higher than its non-affiliated counterparts.

Next fall we are looking forward to extending our campus by two sororities and two fraternities. It is such an exciting time for Greeks at VSU, Go Blazers and Go Greek!
