ADMINISTRATIVE ACHIEVEMENTS

- Management of Department of Political Science as the Head for twenty-one years (1985-2007).
- Oversight of the growth of the department from eight faculty members in 1985 to eighteen in 2005.
- Management of MPA Degree Program from 1985-1989. In 1989 the department added a coordinator position for that program.
- Management and planning for the new Public Personnel Management Track of the MPA, 1985-87.
- Management and planning for the new Bachelor of Legal Assistant Studies Degree Program, 1991-93. In 1994 the department added a faculty member who took over these supervisory functions.
- Guidance and work with Dr. Lee Allen, MPA Coordinator from 1994-97, on obtaining NASPAA accreditation for the MPA degree program. Accreditation was awarded in 1997.
- Work with Dr. Nolan Argyle, MPA Coordinator, on obtaining NASPAA re-accreditation for the MPA degree program. Re-accreditation was granted in 2004-05.
- Work and planning with Dr. Nolan Argyle, MPA Coordinator 1989-94 and 1997 on, on proposing a new DPA degree program. A request for permission from the Board of Regents to present the formal proposal cleared all VSU committees by early 2002. The final proposal was sent to the BOR in December 2005. The degree program was approved in January 2007.
- Effective use of the position of Pizer Professor of International Relations to build outreach activities into the international arena. Dr. Calvin Woodward filled that position from 1986-96. Recruitment of Dr. Michael Baun to that position occurred in 1996, and he is currently in that position.
- Successful application for CUAP Grant from USIA (now under U.S. State Department) in 1999. As a result, VSU established a partnership agreement in a broad range of areas with Palacky University in Olomouc, Czech Republic. During the four year time frame of the grant, 1999-2003, thirty exchange visits took

place between the two universities. More than half of those visits involved semester-length stays that included teaching, joint research projects, work on program building, and involvement in non-profit organizations. Palacky University developed a variety of new courses in public administration, while VSU added new comparative dimensions to existing courses. Work with the department to establish the first honors track of upper-level courses at VSU for majors, 2000-02. Each semester 15-20 students enroll in honors courses, and each year several students graduate with honors.
