NORSE NEOPAGANISM: A RETURN TO SPIRITUAL ROOTS OR AN EXCUSE FOR RACISM?

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This paper examines the emergence of Norse Neopaganism, focusing specifically on Asatrú and its variants within the United States. The relationship between white supremacist groups and Norse Neopaganism will be explored, as well as the conflict between white supremacist Christians and white supremacist Neopagans. The paper demonstrates the evolution of this diverse set of religions and their potential impact on society.
