PERSPECTIVES 2330H: Honors Perspectives on Women in the Visual Arts

CATALOGUE DESCRIPTION:

An enhanced study of global and regional artistic and cultural achievements by women from the prehistoric period to the late 20th century, in the context of social, political, economic and historic issues.

TEXT: Women Artists in History, Slatkin, Wendy, 1997 and selected readings.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

At the end of the course students will be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate knowledge of global and regional perspectives in the arts, particularly as related to women.
- 2. Demonstrate an understanding of the art of women artists as influenced by their specific social, political, economic and historical issues.
- 3. Identify major women artists in history from different historical periods and across global boundaries.
- 4. Compare and contrast artistic styles and significant works of major women artists from different historical periods and across global boundaries.

COURSE OUTCOMES:

This course meets the following educational outcomes:

- 1. Students will distinguish art produced by women based on different political, cultural, and aesthetic experiences.
- 2. Students will compare and contrast art produced by women from an informed global and regional perspective.
- 3. Students will critique visual art based on interdisciplinary visual and written materials.

Choose a woman artist's work to research. As soon as possible, please visit a museum or gallery, look at a book, or look online. After you have seen a significant amount of art, choose one object (it can be a painting, photograph or a sculpture) from any period that you find interesting. Cite the following information which you will include in your paper:

Description: HOW?

(How does the object look?)

Analysis:

WHY?

(Why does the object look like that?)

Synthesis:

SO WHAT?

(Thesis: what is the artistic and cultural significance

of this object?)

1. Description - Factual information:

Artist's name

Title of the artwork

Date that the artwork was created

Medium (the materials that the artwork is made of)

Size or approximate size of the artwork

2. Analysis - Description of the work in your own words:

This must be a written description of the work in your own words. Write no more than three pages for this part. Describe everything you see in the work and information about what story or idea the object depicts. Please also explain why you chose this work and give your impression of the work.

- Analysis: Breaking the whole into parts for understanding
- The type of analysis depends on your thesis.
- Include elements and principles of design: subject, lines, medium, color, light, space, composition, scale, and technique. Ask: How does the art work in formal terms? Mean in formal terms?
- Follow with discussion of <u>period style</u>. Style is revealed in the <u>form</u>.

3. Synthesis - Thesis of paper: so what factor

- Thesis communicates to viewer *how* to see and experience.
- Process of interpretation
- Process of critical thinking
- 4. Please come up with no less than five (5) questions that you have about your work of art that you would like to try to answer during your research on the object.
- 5. All papers must be typed on clean white paper, double-spaced with 1" inch margins all around. Please use Times New Roman font no larger than 12 pt. Please check for spelling errors and grammatical errors before handing the paper in. Points will be deducted for these errors.
- 6. Find five-eight sources of information you can use in your paper, at least four which must be books.

These sources will be your working bibliography. Turn in your working bibliography and steps 1-6 of your research paper on February 15th.

- 7. Please find out as much information about your artist's life, education, activities, and significance her respective history of art.
- 8. Also find out the story behind your art object.
- 9. This essay is a narrative in your own words. I am not interested in reading papers in which you simply cut-and-paste material right from the books into your papers. Write the paper as if you were trying to teach someone who knows nothing about art, and you are teaching in your own words about the work you chose, recounting what you learned from your research in the essay.
- 10. You must use proper footnotes and a bibliography. Information you find in books, magazines, websites, etc. and used in your paper must be cited properly using footnotes. See the attached sample page as a guide. We will also review the proper form in class. Use Chicago/Turabian Style. This format information can be found in Odum Library and online. Papers submitted without footnotes, with footnotes in improper form, or without a proper bibliography will not be accepted.
- 11. This assignment must be typed on clean, white paper and should be between 10-15 pages, NOT including the cover page and the bibliography page. Again, please check for spelling and grammatical errors BEFORE you turn in the paper. I will take off points if these errors are present.

Since this course emphasizes art, history, and gender theory, it is interdisciplinary in both nature and content.

The learning outcome for Area B is that "students will demonstrate knowledge of global and regional perspectives in areas such as the arts, humanities, sciences and social sciences." Students will explore the interrelationships between art and the different social, political, religious, cultural and aesthetic experiences of women throughout history. Students will gain a better understanding of how women's art contributed to the shaping of society. PERS 2330H will provide a regional perspective through students visitations to both the VSU Gallery and the Turner Center where they see works by regional artists and compare them to artists from different places and times. They will also write gallery reviews based on those visits.

7. Suggest some appropriate ways of determining whether the students have met those particular objectives:

Viewing and discussing art created by women and reading and discussing art critique. Discussing historical, social, religious, and cultural trends that

helped to shape women's art.

8. What are your suggestions as to how participating departments (or PERS) might evaluate the quality of an interdisciplinary course such as this one?

Through an examination of the material utilized in the course, as well as an examination of the written work of the students in the class.

At present none. This would be the only Honors Perspectives course that covers this topic area. The material in PERS 2330 and PERS 2330H overlap. The main thing that differentiates an Honors course is not subject matter, but approach. Honors classes are more in depth and require students to take more responsibility for their learning. Honors classes are kept small to facilitate close interaction between students and between students and the instructor. PERS 2330H differs from PERS 2330 in that students will read more, write more and discuss more.


