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Our department offers a significant number of service courses aiming to provide students with a solid foundation in Earth Sciences. However, there is currently only one introductory lab science course (GEOG 1112K: Introduction to Weather and Climate) that focuses on understanding weather events, a topic of increased interest and importance today. There is no non-lab science course with a focus on how weather events have impacted society. A course about how weather changed human history provides a unique, interdisciplinary lens to understand past impacts of weather on human history. The course will also be submitted to fulfill a non-lab science course STEM core requirement. With the changes in the number of credit hours required in the STEM core for non-STEM majors (from 11 to 10), this 3-credit hour non-lab science course would help meet the increased demand (once approved to be a core course).

The course will be added to the current course rotation, and no extra personnel or resources will be needed.

Course Outcomes:

This is a **Core IMPACTS** course that is part of the **Technology, Mathematics & Sciences** area.

Core IMPACTS refers to the core curriculum, which provides students with essential knowledge in foundational academic areas. This course will help master course content, and support students' broad academic and career goals.

This course should direct students toward a broad Orienting Question:

- How do I ask scientific questions or use data, mathematics, or technology to understand the universe?

Completion of this course should enable students to meet the following Learning Outcome:

- Students will use the scientific method and laboratory procedures or mathematical and computational methods to analyze data, solve problems, and explain natural phenomena.

Course content, activities and exercises in this course should help students develop the following Career-Ready Competencies:

- Inquiry and Analysis
- Problem-Solving
- Teamwork

The Objectives and Outcomes of this course address Environmental Geosciences Major Outcomes 1, 2, and 3 as shown in the Undergraduate Catalog.

- To provide a working knowledge of the basic research tools in physical and cultural geography, environmental research, and in digital cartography.
- To provide the knowledge required to evaluate and interpret environmental data, address and analyze regional environmental questions and synthesize and recommend solutions to a range of environmental problems.
- To provide the analytical and technical skills necessary for geographical research including: spatial and temporal analysis; digital and conventional mapping; and analysis and interpretation of data.

Course Overview:

Course Description: An examination of the impacts of weather events on human history. The course investigates significant past weather events, such as hurricanes, blizzards, floods and droughts that have converged with critical moments in human civilization, thereby altering pivotal historical moments in early and modern history.

Learning Outcomes: Students who successfully complete this course will be able to:

- Explain the relationship between weather, climate, and history.
- Understand the science behind weather events.
- Interpret historical evidence (chronicles, archaeological data, climate proxies) related to past weather events.
- Identify major historical weather events and describe their immediate and long-term impacts on human history.
- Explain how short-term weather events and long-term climate trends have influenced historical outcomes.
- Analyze societal resilience, adaptation, and vulnerability to significant weather events.

Course Format: This course uses a learning format that integrates face-to-face lectures, assigned videos and readings, and structured discussions. The course is designed to put major emphasis on active learning, critical thinking, and the examination of real-world weather events in a historical context.

Prerequisites: No prerequisites required.

Required Textbooks:

- Introduction to Weather and Climate (Online through BlazeVIEW)
- Durschnied, E. 2012: The Weather Factor: How Nature Has Changed History. Academic Publishing, New York
- Other required online articles, videos, and podcasts are available to read or watch in BlazeVIEW.

Attendance:

Regular attendance and participation are essential for success in class. You will be expected to physically attend all scheduled course sessions, to complete and submit assignments on time, to participate in ongoing discussions, and to interact with other students and your instructor regularly. Be sure to read and observe the following expectations:

- Submit work on time.
- Keep your instructor informed of your status.
- Review your instructor's feedback carefully and learn from it.
- In any course, problems associated with attendance or completion of assignments may arise. Unless you make prior arrangements with your instructor, you should be prepared to submit work on time. Students who turn in late work may be subject to penalties. Whether online or face-to-face, a student who misses or does not participate in more than 20% of the scheduled course or course activities could be subject to receiving a failing grade in the course.

The course has a total of 690 points, divided as follows:

• Midterm Exam (Total: 150 points)	21.7%

• Discussion Questions (Total: 130 points; 14 questions, drop the lowest score)	18.9%

An Example of Grade Determination

- Jane Smart scores 10 points in first 13 discussion questions, and she got 5 points for the last DQ (dropped as her lowest score). Her actual points for DQs will be: $[(10 \times 13) + 5] - 5 = 130$
- She scores perfectly in 13 quizzes and got 19 out of 20 questions correct for the last quiz. Thus, she drops her lowest score - 19. Her actual points for quizzes will be: $[(20 \times 13) + 19] - 19 = 260$
- Jane scores 80% in the midterm exam. Her actual points are 120.
- Jane scores 90% in the final exam. Her actual points are 135.

Determination of Jane's grade: $(645/690) \times 100 = 93.5\%$.

Check the letter grade table of the syllabus, 93.5% falls in the A range, so Jane's final grade for the class is an A.

Midterm and Final Exams: Exams will be based on material covered in the textbook lectures, and PDF PowerPoint slides in BlazeVIEW. Be sure that you examine and understand the concepts, ideas, and terms for each chapter; some of these will be discussed in slides, but others will be in the textbook only. Exams will consist of multiple choice and/or true-false questions, with each question weighted at two points. The midterm exam and the final exam will each include 75 questions totaling 150 points each. Optional videos in each unit in BlazeVIEW are optional, great for learning, but not required and not graded.

Quizzes: There will be a total of 14 quizzes based on readings and analyses of each chapter in the textbook. There will be 14 online quizzes in total. Each quiz includes 20 one-point questions. You have 30 minutes for each quiz. Please save each of your answers when taking quizzes or exam to avoid any loss of points due to computer crash or internet problems. You can either drop one quiz with your lowest score or skip a quiz at your own choice.

Discussion questions (DQ): Discussion questions are online and include 14 questions that you are required to answer. Each question counts as 10 points. Besides your own post, you also need to reply to at least one classmate to get the full 10 points. Some of the questions are controversial, and there are no right and wrong answers. However, when you state your opinion, please be logical, rational, and respectful to others' opinions, and please give supporting evidence to your arguments as well. Please cite your references each time you use other people's work: books, research articles, etc. Please make sure your answer is substantial,

which normally means it includes at least 200 words, and it demonstrates your understanding of the concepts, and how to apply the concepts to a real-world case. Please post your answers before 11:59pm EST on the due dates. You can either drop one DQ with your lowest score or skip a DQ with your own choice. Your total DQ score will be entered in the grade book after you finish your last DQ.

Testing and Assignment Policy: Exams, quizzes, and discussion questions should be completed at the scheduled time. NO early final exam is allowed. Exams must be taken within the timeline. Make-up exams, quizzes, and assignments will not be given unless there is evidence that the absence was the result of a conflict with a scheduled University sports (in such case the instructor must be notified in advance), or *hospitalization* that can be verified with a doctor's excuse note, or funeral announcement with you as one of the survivors. Our department offers a significant number of service courses aiming to provide students with a solid foundation in Earth Sciences. However, there is currently only one introductory lab science course (GEOG 1112K: Introduction to Weather and Climate) that focuses on understanding weather events, a topic of increased interest and importance today. There is no non-lab science course with a focus on how weather events have impacted society. A course about how weather changed human history provides a unique, interdisciplinary lens to understand past impacts of weather on human history. The course will also be

submitted to fulfill a non-lab science course STEM core requirement. With the changes in the number of credit hours required in the STEM core for non-STEM majors (from 11 to 10), this 3-credit hour non-lab science course would help meet the increased demand (once approved to be a core course).

The course will be added to the current course rotation, and no extra personnel or resources will be needed.

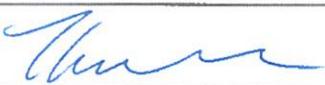

Updating curriculum to reflect deactivation of BIOL1100 and increasing interdisciplinary nature of biology degree to reflect different career paths and career-readiness. Curriculum was reorganized with 4 different concentrations, while maintaining the focus on biology and chemistry analytical and technical skills, and increasing flexibility. The General Biology pathway and EEEB concentration are similar to the current BS in Biology with the exception of not requiring PHYS II and CHEM 3601 for the students, although these classes are options, along with other STEM courses. The MCBB pathway retains both PHYS II and CHEM3601, and the Biomedical Sciences requires CHEM 3601 and recommends PHYS II because it is required for many professional programs. The pathways were designed to best prepare students for many different types of careers.

Also in keeping with peer institutions, courses focused on college readiness, professional practices, and integrated mentoring have been placed throughout the degree to support level-appropriate objectives. These integrated interventions will not only assist students in progressing more effectively through their degree and boost retention, but they will also make sure that students are pursuing the best degree for their professional goals.

ART 1001 is critical to this larger redesign, providing first year students with critical information that will assist them in identifying and pursuing the right career path for their personal goals. In addition to exposing our students to important skills and approaches for academic and professional success within a creative field, it will also serve as a form of advising, making sure that students understand the difference between the two degrees and are choosing to pursue the one that best fits their post-graduate plans.

The redesign of the BA and BFA has been designed to parallel peer institutions to improve enrollment, retention, and professional success. The course design for the BA has been restructured to provide students with a wider exposure to various art media as well as complement a minor or other courses outside of art. The course design for the BFA has been restructured to provide students with deeper engagement in media of their selection to prepare them more effectively for advanced study or artistic production after graduation. Having our degrees aligned with the coursework of peer institutions should also help to attract more students to our BFA, which has been identified as low producing. Also in keeping with peer institutions, courses focused on college readiness, professional practices, and integrated mentoring have been placed throughout the degree to support level-appropriate objectives. These integrated interventions will not only assist students in progressing more effectively through their degree and boost retention, but they will also make sure that students are pursuing the best degree for their professional goals.

ART 4170 will continue to function as a career-preparation course that develops professional readiness, but the hours of the course have been increased to allow for more focus on writing, research, and preparatory planning for their senior show. This focus on writing and research is in direct response to departmental assessments that have revealed ongoing

weaknesses in student writing and research pertaining to their creative practice (refer to addenda with data regarding departmental assessments of seniors). This course will also function as an important check-in that provides mid-level students with feedback about their planned coursework, making sure that it is appropriate to their degree program, planned senior show content, and post-graduate professional goals. In this way, this revised course assists in retention and advising and more fully develops the various skills required to connect studio practice to professional engagement.
