A. College of Education and Human Services

1. Revised course title and description, Kinesiology and Physical Education (KSPE) 1090, “Racquet Sports”, (RACQUET SPORTS – 1 credit hour, 0 lecture hours, 2 lab hours, and 2 contact hours), was approved effective Spring 2026 with the description changed to read – A fundamental course in racquet... . (pages 3-4).

B. Office of Student Success and Retention

1. New course, Re-Ignite Seminar (RISE) 1000, “Re-Ignite Seminar for Academic Recovery”, (ACADEMIC RECOVERY SEMINAR –0 credit hours, 1 lecture hour, 1 lab hour, and 2 contact hours), was approved effective Spring Semester 2026 – with the description changed to read - Prerequisites: Approved appeal of academic standing suspension or financial aid SAP appeal. Graded "Satisfactory" or "Unsatisfactory". A course supporting undergraduates with fewer than 90 credits allowed to persist through an approved suspension appeal. Students build academic recovery skills through weekly seminars, study hall attendance, and targeted assignments. Emphasis is placed on time management, study strategies, mindset, and effective use of campus resources to regain momentum. (pages 5-12).

New course, Re-Ignite Seminar (RISE) 2000, “Re-Ignite Seminar for Academic Recovery”, (ACADEMIC RECOVERY SEMINAR –0 credit hours, 1 lecture hour, 1 lab hour, and 2 contact hours), was approved effective Spring Semester 2026 – with the description changed to read - Prerequisite: Approved appeal of academic standing suspension or financial aid SAP appeal. Graded "Satisfactory" or "Unsatisfactory". A course supporting undergraduates with 60+ earned credits allowed to persist through an approved suspension appeal. RISE 2000 supports persistence and successful transition to graduation. By focusing on advanced strategies (e.g., degree completion, financial literacy, and career readiness) while maintaining accountability through weekly seminars and study hall. (pages 13-20).
