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<u>The Accelerated Undergraduate-to-Graduate Track is an</u> <u>undergraduate-to-graduate degree program. Students in this</u> <u>track will complete up to 9 graduate hours in Public</u> <u>Administration at the 7000 level that will count toward the</u> <u>completion of the undergraduate degree in Organizational</u> <u>Leadership. These 9 hours may then be applied toward the</u> <u>completion of degree requirements for the MPA degree at</u> <u>Valdosta State University upon graduate admission.</u>

To be admitted to the Accelerated Undergraduate-Graduate Program, students must have completed the courses listed below and have earned a minimum grade of B (or course equivalent), acquired a cumulative VSU GPA of 3.0 or higher, and submit a personal statement not to exceed five (5) pages describing their education and career goals and describe how the program will assist the student achieve their goals.

The student shall submit the Accelerated Undergraduate- to-Graduate application along with two letters of recommendation from VSU Political Science Department faculty to the PADM/ORGL Program Coordinator. The student shall submit a current resume and also submit a writing sample from an ORGL/POLS course to demonstrate writing skills.

Once admitted to the program, a specific course of study will be developed with the student's undergraduate advisor as the student can take one or more graduate classes in the each of the terms remaining to complete their undergraduate degree (Summer/Fall/Spring terms once the student is admitted to the Accelerated Undergraduate-to-Graduate Track).

<u>Graduate courses taken as an undergraduate will count</u> toward the student's undergraduate requirements but will not count toward the student's undergraduate GPA or the calculation of academic honors.

Upon admission to the Accelerated Undergraduate-to-Graduate Track, students must maintain an overall GPA of 3.0 to remain in good standing. Students who do not maintain good standing or who do not wish to continue with the Accelerated Undergraduate-to-Graduate Track may complete the remaining requirements for the Bachelor of Science in Organizational Leadership.

Successful completion of the Accelerated Undergraduate-to-Graduate Track requires a grade of B or better in all graduate level coursework. A grade of "C" earned in a graduate course can still be used for credit toward the undergraduate degree, but such a grade will affect a student's graduate GPA as a grade of "C" creates one deficiency point at the graduate level.

Once a student graduates with the BS in Organizational Leadership, he/she must submit the VSU graduate application form to continue their graduate education in the MPA degree.
