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What is the Core Curriculum?

- The Core Curriculum is made up of 60 credit hours of general education requirements. Most bachelor's degrees require 120 credit hours to complete.
- For the most part it is the same for all students no matter what your major is. There may be restrictions based on your major.
- The core can be found in the undergraduate catalog pp. 82-85 (or on the web).

What are the “credit hours”?

- Each course is given a value called credit hours.
- The majority of the courses you will take are 3-hour courses.
- Perspectives, Physical Education, Music, Theatre, Dance, & VSU course are often 1 or 2 credits.
- Many of the sciences are worth 4 credits.
- Normally the number of hours you spend in class determines the number of credits.

Hours & Your Standing

- 1-29 hours earned = Freshman Standing
- 30-59 hours earned = Sophomore Standing
- 60-89 hours earned = Junior Standing
- 90+ hours earned = Senior Standing

- Each section of the catalog gives you important information about the expectations of your major.
- For example:

COLLEGE OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

Freshmen and sophomore students who declare their intention to pursue one of the majors in business administration may be accepted for advising by business faculty or staff. All students who wish to pursue one of the majors in business administration **beyond their sophomore year** must be accepted to the senior college of the Harley Langdale, Jr. College of Business Administration. Students who meet the following criteria are accepted.

1. Completion of **all junior college requirements** of the Harley Langdale, Jr. College of Business Administration.
2. Successful completion of **both parts of the Regent's** Testing Program (RGTR 0196 and RGTR 0197).
3. A **minimum** over-all Grade Point Average (GPA) of **2.80** (on a 4.00 scale). The GPA calculation is based on all course work, including transfer credits.
4. A **minimum grade of "C" in all courses in Area F** of the junior college core curriculum..

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE WITH A MAJOR IN PSYCHOLOGY

These programs introduce students to the liberal arts and to psychology as a scientific discipline, with content and methods able to improve the human condition. To declare psychology a major you must have **completed 45** hours of coursework in the Core and **earned at least a “C” or better (> 2.0 GPA)** in all your previously attempted coursework. You must also earn a “C” or better (> 2.0 GPA) in each and every required psychology course and prerequisite.

***Guided Electives. 24 hours**

*If Area F requirements for the Valdosta State University B.A. or B.S. degree with a major in psychology are not taken in Area F or another Area, they must be taken as Guided Electives.

University System Regents' Testing Program (pg. 66)

- Each institution of the University System of Georgia must assure the other institutions, and the System as a whole, that students obtaining a degree from that institution possess literacy competence, that is, certain minimum skills of reading and writing.
- Therefore, students enrolled in undergraduate degree programs shall pass the Regents' Test as a requirement for graduation. For undergraduate students at Valdosta State University, the Regents' Test requirement will be fulfilled by a passing grade in English 1102* or an approved substitute.
- * Students failing ENGL 1102 will be required to register for the class each subsequent semester in which they are enrolled at VSU. They will also be required to meet with a tutor in VSU's Student Success Center to develop a remediation plan. See www.valdosta.edu/ssc.

Legislative Requirements (pg 79)

- In accordance with an act of the General Assembly of the State of Georgia, all candidates for degree are required to possess and demonstrate a reasonable mastery of United States history, Georgia history, the United States Constitution, and the Georgia Constitution. These history requirements are met by the successful completion of History 2111 or History 2112. The constitution requirements are met by the successful completion of Political Science 1101 (3 hours). Transfer credit for these three courses may not satisfy the requirements of the State of Georgia. Exemption tests in Georgia History or Georgia Constitution are offered to transfer students whose American History or Political Science course(s) did not include Georgia History or Georgia Constitution and to students who have obtained credit in American Government or in American History via the CLEP program, which does not include credit for satisfying the legislative requirements. See the VSU Testing Office in Powell Hall West concerning the exemption tests in Georgia History and in Georgia Constitution.

So what?

- If you transferred from a college in another state AND you received credit for HIST 2111 or HIST 2112 and/or POLS 1101, then you will need to take a test on Georgia History and/or the Georgia Constitution
- If you have never taken or have not received credit for HIST 2111 or HIST 2112 and/or POLS 1101, then when you take and pass these course you will have completed the requirement.

What if I want to change my major?

- Go to the department of your major.
- Tell them you want to change your major.
- They will either give you your folder or send your folder to the department to which you want to change.
- You will fill out a form that your current department and new department must sign and then send to the registrar's office.

What if I want to add a minor?

- A minor consists of 15-18 hours of course work from an area outside of your major
- 9 hours must be upper division (3000-4000)
