- a) Report from the Chair Laura Pitts

7) Staff Attendance and Participation

- a) Kick Butts Day Rosezella Ward reported 10 tables were located around campus on October 1. Based on the tickets for drawings, about 460 people stopped by the various tables which is pretty good participation.
- b) November 13 is the Great American Smoke Out. Rosezella Ward reported there will be tables around campus and some of the activities from Kick Butts Day will be repeated.
- c) Health and Benefits Fair Rosezella Ward reported there will be a Tobacco Free Campus table there. The BOR is paying for 200 flu shots sign up to receive your free flu shot. There was discussion regarding smoking on public rights of way around campus (sidewalks, etc.). Where people smoke on public rights of way you have to walk

through "clouds of smoke" and butts are dropped on the ground. It will take time for people to adjust – it is a work in progress. Rosezella reminded the group that insurance covers help for quitting smoking. The academic calendar has been approved. Open Enrollment is Nov 3 - 14. Be sure to go in and update. Tobacco users will be charged \$75. Information will be available on the USG website soon. There will be a number of info sessions available to help with open enrollment.

d) COSA Annual Meeting – Bobby Flowers reported that the speakers at this year's meeting were excellent and very motivational. We will try to get the speaker's keynote address on the COSA website. Her name is Linda Hatchett.
