



Benefits of outlines

1.Emphasizes relationships:

The method can help you identify connections between points and sub-points.


2. Improves learning:

As you create an outline, you're actively engaged with the material, which can speed up the learning process.

3. Easier to recall:

You might find it easier to remember ideas later by visualizing where you placed them in your outline.


Concept Maps

- the visual will help you recall information

Foldables

- kinesthetic tool for organizing information
- help students focus on key concepts
- -the visual will help you recall information



Concept Maps

- make connections by chunking the information
- show gaps in learning (you can pinpoint areas where you are unclear in the learning ask for help from your instructor or seek help from a tutor)



- mitosis vs meiosis





Keep track of the progression bar at the top of the screen to motivate and increase your endurance.



Don't use the "I do not know" button: Try your best to answer the questions without using this option


