# 2019-2020 Annual Report of the Faculty Senate Deborah Paine, President

The Faculty Senate met six times during the 2019-2020 academic year. The last two meetings (March and April) were disrupted due to the COVID-19 pandemic that affected the campus (region, state, nation, and world). The executive committee invited President Carvajal and Provost Smith to all meetings. The minutes reflect their attendance and comments. At each meeting, the statutory committees and standing committees of the Senate were encouraged to give reports. A number of meetings featured presentations by guests. Brief Summary of Faculty Senate Activity:

### August 2019

- New and returning senators were welcomed to the new school year.
- John Crawford provided a summary report of the successful capital campaign that concluded in June 2019.
- IPC was asked to research how other institutions utilize this committee.
- The Provost presented updates.

### September 2019

- Campus Wellness provided updates of initiatives for the semester and introduced the new coordinator for campus wellness.
- Comments from the President included preliminary information on the classification and compensation study, the SACSCOC self-report by Dr. Michael Black, and enrollment numbers at that point in time.
- Dr. Paine provided several key reminders for senators to share with colleges.
- Both the President and the Provost presented updates.

#### October 2019

- Heidi Cox presented information concerning the upcoming annual Ethics week activities in early November.
- Alex Daman from the Carl Vinson Institute provided an overview of the salary study conducted for VSU.
- The faculty evaluation model was remanded to the faculty affairs committee.
- Both the President and the Provost presented updates.

#### November 2019

- A report was presented on the recommended changes to the SOI questions and a lengthy discussion ensued concerning the questions. Voting was tabled until the January meeting.
- Several committees reported work on by-laws and campus initiatives.
- Both the President and the Provost presented updates.

### January 2020

- The SOI questions were adopted for use in spring 2020. One question related to helpful feedback and one relating to timely feedback were included.
- The Academic Scheduling Committee changed the fall break for school year 2021-2022 to October 18-19 to accommodate the football schedule so a home football game occurs the same weekend as fall break.
- Several standing and statutory committee reports were presented.
- Both the President and the Provost presented updates.

### February 2020

- Information regarding a new VSU diabetes prevention program was presented by Dr. LaGary Carter.
- Dr. Charles Talor presented information regarding the Blazer Summer Research Institute and Competition.
- Educational Policies reported on their task to review a possible grading scale change.
   The committee recommended to not move forward with a +/- grading scale, and the senate voted to follow this recommendation.
- Both the President and the Provost presented updates.

#### March 2020

Due to the mandates in response to the COVID-19 virus pandemic, this meeting was cancelled. However, nominations for the executive committee were accepted electronically.

### **April 2020**

Due to the mandates in response to the COVID-19 virus pandemic, this meeting was not held. The election of the 2020-2021 executive committee was completed via Qualtrics.
