Theme

Humanity – (The Cross Section Where We All Meet)
Compassion, creativity, empathy, love, effective
communications, faith and hope are just a few qualities
that make us human. Historically, BIPOC (Black, Indigenous
(and) People of Color) have fought and continue to fight
to be viewed through the lens of humanity which the
constitution speaks of for all citizens. This opportunity is
open for all VSU students to create their own interpretation
on the theme.

Eligibility and Entry Requirements

The exhibition and competition is **open to all** Valdosta State University students. (You <u>do not</u> have to be an art major to participate.)

All work must be original, completed within the last two years, and not previously exhibited with the Department of Diversity and Inclusion.

All visual media is welcome (2D/3D/4D).

- 2D work must be either framed or mounted to foamboard, and not exceed 48" in any dimension.
- 3D work must not exceed 24" in any dimension and be self-supporting.
- 4D work must not exceed 3 minutes long.
- Please refer to submission instructions for specific file formats.

Digital images of artwork due - Fri, Sept. 3rd Notification of accepted work - Tue, Sept. 7th (giving students enough time to properly mat, frame, finish pieces prior to drop off date).

Exhibition Date and Times - Fri, Sept. 17th

*Reminder, if artist is unable to drop off accepted work at designated drop-off time, they need to make accommodations prior to Friday with the Department of Diversity and Inclusion.

Submission Instructions

Artists may enter up to a maximum of three pieces. Please visit https://blog.valdosta.edu/studentcomp. Works will be reviewed digitally by the selection team. Artists will be notified if their submissions were selected for inclusion in the exhibition. The selection team reserves the right to eliminate any work which does not meet the standards of quality for the exhibition or does not address the theme. Works not meeting these requirements WILL NOT be considered for the exhibition. Each entry must be a .jpg for 2D/3D work; 4D entries must be in a .mp4 file format.

Delivery and Pick up of Artwork

Accepted pieces must be hand-delivered between 8 a.m. - 10 a.m. on Friday, September 17th, 2nd floor of the Student Union (near the Starbucks). In the event that an <u>artist can</u> <u>not drop</u> off their work during the designated delivery time, you must coordinate with the Department of Student Diversity and Inclusion to drop off the day before. Pick-up of work will occur the same day once the exhibition has ended.

Prizes

Three monetary awards will be given in addition to honorable mentions. Awards include: 3rd place - \$100, 2nd place - \$200, 1st place \$500. Please note: 1st place \$500 award is a purchase award. The selected piece will become part of the Diversity and Inclusion Office's permanent collection. If your work is part of the accepted selections, and you wish **not** to have your work considered for the Diversity and Inclusion Purchase Award, please mark "no" on the label on the next page. Your work will still be eligible for the other awards.



Entry Fee

FREE to enter. No entry fee required.

Selection Team and Jurors

All submitted work will be reviewed and evaluated digitally for inclusion in the exhibition by the Selection Team. Students will have two weeks from the notification date to prepare the artwork for exhibition (framed, etc..) On the day of the exhibition, two jurors will judge the accepted artworks in the exhibit and will determine which ones shall receive special recognition and awards.

Liability and Commitment

All reasonable precautions will be taken by the Department of Student Diversity and Inclusion to ensure the artwork is protected while at the exhibition site. Please note, however, no liability will be assumed by VSU. Artists are advised to take every precaution when delivering work to the exhibition site.

Submitting an entry form to this exhibition constitutes an agreement on the part of the artists with all conditions to this prospectus. No work accepted for the exhibition may be withdrawn before the closing date. We reserve the right to refuse any entry, if, upon arrival, the work is found unacceptable.
