The Georgia Legislature designated Valdosta State's summer stock theatre program the Official Musical Theatre of the State of Georgia, a tribute to the university's commitment to support the growth of South Georgia by fostering an environment of creativity and scholarship.

Over the past four years Peach State Summer Theatre has earned 31 Broadway World Tallahassee Awards, including repeated Favorite Local Theatre honors.

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Harold Arlen In 1929, Arlen composed his first well-known song: "Get Happy" (with lyrics by Ted Koehler). Throughout the early and mid-1930s, Arlen and Koehler wrote shows for the Cotton Club, a popular Harlem night club, as well as Broadway musicals and Hollywood films. Songs from this period include "I've Got the World On A String" and "Stormy Weather." In 1938, Arlen and Y. E. Harburg werehired by Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer to compose songs for The Wizard of Oz. The most famous of these is the song "Somewhere Over the Rainbow". In the 1940s, Arlen teamed up with lyricist Johnny Mercer, and continued with song hits "Blues In The Night", and "Ac-cent-uate The Positive".

Howard Ashman Best known as a pivotal creative mind behind the renaissance of Disney animation and his work on The Little Mermaid, Aladdin and Beauty and The Beast (which is dedicated to, "Our friend, Howard Ashman, who gave a Mermaid her voice and a Beast his soul...") Ashman's first love was theater. Ashman was a founder of off Broadway's renowned WPA Theater, where he conceived, wrote and directed God Bless You, Mr. Rosewater, as well as the classic musical. Little Shop of Horrors (both music by Alan Menken), In 1986, he wrote and directed the Broadway musical Smile (music by Marvin Hamlisch). Lamented as a lost treasure of the 1980's theater scene. Smile remains popular on High School and College campuses throughout the country. For more information, please visit howardashman.com

E. Y. (Yip) Harburg in a career spanning over fifty years, was known as "Broadway's social conscience." A master lyricist, poet and book writer, Yip was always dedicated to social justice. He wrote the words to over 600 songs, most notably all the lyrics in the 1939 motion picture classic **The Wizard of Oz**, including "Over the Rainbow" which was voted the Number 1 recording of the 20th century in a 2001 poll conducted by the National Endowment for the Humanities and the Recording Industry Association of America.

Alan Menken (Composer). Theater: God Bless You Mr Rosewater, Little Shop Of Horrors, Real Life Funnies, Atina: Evil Queen Of The Galaxy, Kicks, The Apprenticeship Of Duddy Kravitz, Beauty And The Beast, A Christmas Carol, Weird Romance, King David, Der Glöckner Von Notre Dame, The Little Mermaid, Sister Act. Leap Of Faith, Aladdin and Newsies, Film: Little Shop Of Horrors, The Little Mermaid, Beauty And The Beast, Newsies, Aladdin, Pocahontas, The Hunchback Of Notre Dame, Hercules, Life With Mikev. Lincoln, Home On The Range, Noel, Enchanted, Shagay Dog. Tangled and Mirror Mirror. Songs: Rocky V. Home Alone 2 and Captain America, Awards: 8 Oscars (19 nominations), 11 Grammys (including Song of the Year), 7 Golden Globes, Tony® (plus 4 nominations), Drama Desk, Outer Critics Circle, New York Drama Critics, Olivier and London's Evening Standard Award, Drama League. Honors: Songwriter's Hall of Fame. Doctorates from New York University and University of North Carolina School of the Arts.

Dean Regan created A Closer Walk with Patsv **Cline** in 1991 in Vancouver, BC and the show instantly became a sold out hit that toured across Canada. A nine-month run at the Playhouse Theatre in Boston Massachusetts was the first U.S. exposure and the show subsequently did two U.S. national tours, enjoying an award-winning 30+ week run at the 4000-seat Grand Palace Theatre in Branson, MO (under the title Patsy!) A Closer Walk with Patsy **Cline** has since been produced by over 150 theatre companies throughout North America. Dean had personally directed over 20 productions of the show and has since developed a series of hit musicals including: Red Rock Diner which premiered in Canada at the Arts Club Theatre Company (Vancouver, BC), and in the U.S. at the Hallmark Theatre (Kansas City, MO); Forever Swing, the popular big band musical which enjoyed a 12 week sold out premiere run in Vancouver, BC before playing to packed houses and rave reviews on two national tours: Black and Gold Revue at the Arts Club Theatre (Vancouver, BC): Hotel Porter (Cole Porter Revue) at the Stanley Theatre (Vancouver BC), and the celebrated *Clooney Tunes* (Rosemary Clooney Revue) at the Victoria Theatre (Petrolia, ON) which received overwhelming popular and critical response.




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Theatre Etiquette Tips

Stay & Show Your Appreciation

A quick departure is noticed by everyone in the audience, and especially, by the performers on stage. Making a mad dash for the exit expresses inconsiderate behavior. The performers CAN and WILL see you, so please wait until the house lights go up.

We Were Here: Where Were You?

Arriving tardy to the theatre is never considered "fashionably late." After the performance has begun, latecomers will be asked to wait until a suitable time before being seated. The same reminder applies at intermission. Leaving your seat during the performance may also keep you from being allowed to re-enter until an appropriate time.

The Great Escape

Just as you mentally leave your earthly boundaries and are transported to another time and place

becoming one with the performers – SUDDENLY your neighbor starts "beeping" like a four alarm fire. Watches with alarms, beepers, and CELL PHONES are distracting and annoying to everyone so please turn them off. Be considerate of your neighbors as you would expect the same consideration from them.

Hearing a Pin Drop

We are delighted if the performance proves to be the "talk of the town," but please wait until intermission or the final curtain to carry on lengthy conversations. In addition, everyone will certainly hear the sound of a crumpling cellophane wrapper from a piece of candy. Why not "pop" your candy into your mouth before entering the theatre!

Lighting Up the Night

Please refrain from using text messaging devices. The clicking sound and glow is distracting to the cast and your fellow audience members.
