Welcome to the 2022 Peach State Summer Theatre season at Valdosta State University.

We are delighted to have you join us for what promises to be an entertaining lineup of performances — a musical revue tribute to the musicians of the Harlem Renaissance; the timeless enchantment of a magical fairy tale; and a feel-good comedy about the power of sisterhood.

Peach State Summer Theatre is Valdosta's premiere professional summer stock theatre. Each summer, dozens of singers, dancers, technicians, managers, and creators gather on the campus of VSU for approximately 10 weeks, and during that time, they rehearse, build, and present three musicals in rotating repertory.

PSST started in 1990 as the Jekyll Island Music Festival. In 2005 it was relocated to VSU and renamed PSST. The 2020 season was cancelled due to the spread of COVID-19. The 2021 season featured a 10-performance run of one musical and offered both a live studio audience experience and live streaming to audiences at home.

This year we are thrilled to celebrate PSST's return to its traditional three-musical season. We have missed the energy and excitement a full summer of Broadway-style musical theatre brings to our campus, our city, and our region.

The Georgia Legislature designated Valdosta State's summer stock theatre program the Official Musical Theatre of the State of Georgia, a tribute to the university's commitment to support the growth of South Georgia by fostering an environment of creativity and scholarship.

To the artists who are calling VSU home through the summer... Welcome to the Blazer Nation family. We are grateful for your tireless dedication to the performing arts and your willingness to share your talents with us.

Please join me in wishing her the best in her retirement and celebrating her plans to spend more time with friends and family.


