Devising Iphigenia

The script for *Iphigenia 2.5* was developed by the Fall 2024 Devised Theatre Class. This class consisted students of many backgrounds – theatre and non-theatre students alike. Of the theatre students, the devising group included students from Musical Theatre, Performance, and Production tracks.

The process began with an initial reading and analysis of Charles Mee's *Iphigenia 2.0* script. The class then read Charles Walker's translation of Euripides' *Iphigenia at Aulis* and compared the two versions of the story. Afterwards the group developed a prioritization of what aspects of Mee's script they wanted to maintain or change, with the editing of the script divided into groups. These edits included character, action, and dialogue/stage directions.

The script developed through many revisions over the course of the semester. As writers, the Devised Theatre class worked very hard in their revisions to emulate Mee's original script while expanding the story with their own original content. Once the semester was complete, the script became finalized by the director and production dramaturg.

Once rehearsals began, the devising process continued, with opportunities for the cast to create their own contributions to the script, through physical and verbal additions, like creating their own soldier chants.

From script to stage, *Iphigenia 2.5* is a truly collaborative effort from VSU Theatre & Dance.

Last year more than 1,500 productions were entered in the KCACTF involving more than 200,000 students nationwide. By entering this production, our theater department is sharing in the KCACTF goals to recognize, reward, and celebrate the exemplary work produced in college and university theaters across the nation.
