The Department of Music seeks to fill a non-tenure track faculty position beginning August 1, 2021, and ending May 9, 2022, for the 2021-22 academic year. The selected candidate will be responsible for teaching courses in the candidate's area of expertise and participating in service at the department, college, and university levels. Rank for the position will be dependent upon credentials.

Responsibilities include maintaining a high-quality studio of undergraduate and graduate voice majors and minors; teaching across all majors including BA, BM, MAT and MMP; other teaching duties may include vocal pedagogy, vocal methods, diction, song literature, musical theatre vocal coaching, studio classes; teaching applied students in both the Department of Music and Theatre Program (Musical Theatre emphasis).

Required Qualifications

- Master's in Music;
- Evidence of active performing schedule;
- Evidence of Studio teaching experience at university level;
- Soprano and MezzoSoprano voice;
- Demonstrated commitment to excellence in teaching and learning;
- Commitment to diversity and inclusion.

Preferred Qualifications

- An earned doctorate in music;
- Functional piano skills;
- Musical Theatre experience in addition to traditional vocal training and Contemporary Commercial Music;
- Evidence of teaching experience at the university level;
- A record of effective teaching appropriate to the applicant's career stage;
- Ability to work effectively in a collaborative setting;
- A record of mentoring students of diverse backgrounds.
