## <u>Upcoming 10th Annual Dr. Robert A. Hull Jr.'s Memorial</u> <u>Lecture Series</u> - Postponed by Hurricane Helene



Dr. Robert A. Hull, Jr.'s foresight in academia led him to develop and teach undergraduate and graduate courses at Ball State University and Valdosta State University. In addition to his role as a beloved professor and advisor, Bob was a clinical supervisor, a clinic director, an off campus placement coordinator, and the parliamentarian and executive secretary of the university faculty senate.

His impact on the SLP profession spanned the country through his service to multiple state and national professional organizations, including being a member of GSHA for 23 years. Over time, he held every office in the association, including President for two terms. He also served on several ASHA committees and was the Publications and Technology Chair for the Council of State Association Presidents, an affiliation of ASHA. At the 2009 GSHA annual convention, he was awarded the Honors of the Association in recognition of his outstanding performance in clinical service, academic teaching, service to GSHA, and service to other local, regional, and national organizations.

Dr. Hull will always be remembered for his love for family, VSU, and his students. All proceeds from the Hull Memorial Lecture Series benefit the Dr. Robert A. Hull Scholarship Fund.

#### **Students Volunteer at The Canopy**

Every semester, the students in Dr. Hannibal's Aphasia class complete a Gerontology interaction project at The Canopy at Azalea Grove, where they further their knowledge in geriatrics. #### **Students Volunteer at Camp SPEAK!**



Camp SPEAK is an overnight camp that offers a fun environment for children who use augmentative communication devices ages 5-18. Each child will be paired with a Speech Language Pathologist graduate student and experience 4 days of adapted activities under supervision of some of the best therapists in the State! While the kids are having a great time parents will have opportunities to connect, receive individual attention from vendors, or attend in-services and training. Camp Speak is a collaborative effort involving organizations such as Atlanta Neurogenic Institute, Tools for Life, University of Georgia, and Georgia State.

Some of our graduate clinicians had the opportunity to attend this camp and assist in adapted activities for children with AAC devices. This camp gave our students the opportunity to have field experience outside of a clinical setting and provided a unique opportunity to work with children with AAC devices.
