## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Bachelor's degree from a regionally-accredited institution
- Minimum undergraduate GPA of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale
- If undergraduate GPA is below a 2.75, applicants must submit acceptable GRE or MAT scores
- Hold a level 4 clear/renewable or induction (pathways 1-3) teaching certificate in Early Childhood Education
