Meeting called to order by Dr. Leech at 9:00 am.

Approval of Minutes: The minutes were approved with no corrections.

STW conference and GAHPERD/CPRESA workshop: Dr. Sanderson informed the committee of the upcoming STW (Share The Wealth) Conference. The conference is scheduled to take place in Jekyll Island at the Convention Center on January 24 -26, 2019. This is a health and physical education conference/workshop. Dr. Sanderson is the point of contact for anyone that is interested in attending this event. The GAHPERD/CPRESA workshop (Georgia Association for Health, Physical Education Recreation, and Dance) is scheduled for May 7, 2019 from 7:45 am – 4:00 pm.

BSED /SED: Dr. Radcliffe provided an overview of the BSED in Education with a major in Secondary Education as it will go online for a vote. All of the paperwork needs to be submitted to the UAC prior to February 4, 2019. The goal is for the program to start Fall 2019. It is a collaboration with the BA in English and BA History (double major). All of the others are a standalone. Dr. Radcliffe distributed a BSED in Secondary Education overview of the Program of Study along with the Curriculum Form.

Blazer Guardian App: Dr. Marciano asked the faculty to include on their syllabi the Blazer Guardian App (Apple QR code & Android code). Ms. Tracy Burch can send out the link.

College Syllabus Template: Dr. Most suggested and the committee agreed that a small committee should be formed to work on this template. This will be discussed at a later time.

Dr. Becky da Cruz...IRB issue: Dr. da Cruz joined by the OSPRA team (Ms. Ann Ophie, Shay Wilford, and Tina Wright) informed the committee of the change in practice in regard to the IRB. They discussed how these changes relate to Minors on Campus and class projects. The committee reviewed the new form. An email notification will be sent to everyone when the forms are accessible online.

Re-Organization: Dr. Oliver informed the committee that Dr. Smith would like to meet with the committee to discuss the reorganization (possibly at our next meeting).

Schedule Compression: Dr. Oliver informed the committee that the provost is interested in the FTF 10:00 am – 2:00 pm courses. The focus is on the undergraduate courses. Dr. Kuhlmann presented the committee with a draft of the COEHS total courses by course level.

Schedule Planner: Dr. Oliver asked that all chairs go through the schedule planner, because it may have an impact on student retention. Please work with Dr. Rubin to resolve any conflicts.

Other Business:

Dr. Leech informed the committee that on March 13th is FGE. We have been asked to sponsor the State Bowl, and he may be asking for 9 or ten volunteers. He will send more information at a later time.
