Primary Outcomes: Introductions. The Council discussed an overview of recent successes and growth of the program. Discussed opportunities to expand awareness of services offered at FamilyWorks including: attend monthly meetings sponsored by the mental health community (LIPT, LCCY), offering continuing education opportunities to leadership in the faith community and Vacation Bible School sponsors, and employees at nursing homes. Discussed qualities members find most important in new graduates hired into mental health positions, including: ethics, work ethic, and collaborative documentation.
