
## Alumni Survey - Two Years After Graduation Program Completers Between 2013-2017

Each spring, graduates of the MLIS program are asked to evaluate their preparation to enter the professional workforce two years after program graduation. The same evaluation categories, which are based on ALA standards, are used in the alumni survey that were used in the graduation survey that students complete in their last semester of the MLIS program. Results from the alumni survey are reported for the last five years.






## Charts on Percentage of Respondents Who Selected 'Strongly Agree' or 'Agree'




...effectively perform library technical or technology services such as cataloging, acquisitions, serials management, OR circulation systems management to meet needs in a library or information center.




...integrate relevant research to enhance my work in a library or information center.
