# MLIS 7355 Advanced Classification Syllabus--Fall Semester 2009

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# **Course Description**

Prerequisite: MLIS 7300 or consent of the instructor. 3 hours credit. Advanced study of the subject classification of recordable knowledge. Verbal and numeric approaches, including Library of Congress and Dewey Decimal classification schemes and the principles of thesaurus construction will be considered.

# Learning Outcomes (LO)

Students will:

- 1. Classify library materials using Library of Congress verbal and numeric schemes.
- 2. Classify library materials using Dewey Decimal Classification.
- 3. Apply the principles of thesaurus construction and use.
- 4. Identify and interpret relevant documentation and tools.

**Midterm Quiz**, available on Sept 31 and due on Oct 7, will be open-book and open-note. Questions types may include multiple choice, short answer, matching, or short essay.

**Thesaurus Construction assignment** will utilize the Roe & Thomas text. Due on December 9. Progress report due Nov. 4. Live Classroom to discuss Progress Reports during week of Nov 9. See detailed guidelines in BlazeVIEW.

**Individual Exploration Project:** an investigation of a topic of your choice, subject to instructor concurrence, related to classification of information or knowledge, broadly defined. One product will be a Live Classroom presentation. Other products will be negotiated with the instructor and will depend on the nature of the project. Examples of possible products include, but are not limited to, a paper, a cataloging plan for a collection, a set of records, a procedure manual, a website, a tutorial, or a research proposal. More detailed guidelines will be posted in BlazeVIEW. During the first week of class, use BlazeVIEW mail to begin discussing your project topic with Dr. Yontz.

# Grading

There are 100 points possible in the course. Course grades will be assigned as follows:

### **Attendance Policy**

The Live Classroom sessions will be archived for later viewing or reviewing. There is a required Live Classroom discussion during the week of November 9; times for these discussion sessions will be identified in consultation with class members. The Individual Exploration Project requires a Live Classroom presentation; each student will negotiate an individual presentation time with the instructor.

### **Technical Requirements**

All assignments must be submitted using computer programs that are compatible with VSU supported products. For word processed documents, MS Word is the preferred format. If you are using a lower version of WordPerfect or some other word processor, save your documents in Rich Text Format (rtf).

When reading instructions for your assignments, notice whether the instructions say to paste your response into a message box or to use a file attachment. Also notice whether the instructions say to choose Reply or to create a new message.

When the directions say to paste into a BlazeVIEW message box, *compose your response in your word processor first*. This will help avoid the agony of being "timed out" and losing your work.

Grammar, punctuation, and spelling count. Use spell check.

A headset with attached microphone and noise-canceling properties is **required**. Though other types of microphones and speakers can seem to work, and sometimes do, the headset with attached microphone and noise-canceling properties is most likely to work well.
