## MLIS Program at Valdosta State University Spring 2018 Survey Results

The MLIS Program provides an ALA accredited education for librarians for academic, public, and special libraries.

Every semester graduating students in the MLIS Program are asked to evaluate their preparation to become entry level professional librarians or entry level information services professionals. 91% of AY17-18 responding graduates agreed they were prepared for entry level professional work upon graduation.

## Evaluation categories include:

- Perform administrative functions
- Provide effective public service
- Perform library technical services
- Use existing and emerging technologies
- Integrate relevant research
- Demonstrate professionalism

In the spring of 2018, 2016 graduates of the MLIS Program were asked to look back and evaluate their preparation to enter the professional workforce two years after graduation, using the same categories as above. 70% of responding 2016 graduates felt they had been effectively prepared to work in a professional capacity in a library or information center.


