# GLA 2020 Scholarship

The Georgia Library Association awards two scholarships annually to students pursuing a master's degree in library science. The Scholarship Committee is currently accepting applications for the 2020 scholarship awards.

The Hubbard Scholarship of the Georgia Library Association is made possible by the family and friends of Mr. C. S. Hubbard, an early supporter of libraries in Georgia. The \$3,000 Scholarship award, is intended to recruit excellent candidates for librarianship in Georgia and provide financial assistance toward completing a Master's degree in library science.

The Beard Scholarship, in the amount of \$1,500, is made possible by friends and colleagues of the late Charles Edward Beard who served libraries and the library profession for almost 40 years with distinction and dedication. The purpose of this scholarship is to provide financial assistance toward completing a Master's degree in library science for candidates who show strong potential to inspire and motivate their peers in the profession and in professional associations.

Recipients of both awards must agree to work for at least one year in a library-related capacity in Georgia following graduation. Applicants need not be residents of Georgia to apply. 






# SOLIS is Seeking Your Input
