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Clinical Experiences Collaborative Partnership

Valdosta State University

The Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia by and on behalf of Valdosta State University ("VSU") through its Dewar College of Education and Human Services (COEHS) and SUFFOLK PUBLIC SCHOOLS (SPS) located in SUFFOLK, VIRGINIA agree to enter into this Partnership for the establishment and maintenance of a mutually-beneficial partnership. The parties agree that while we recognize that each partnership is unique, the following common principles are intended to facilitate all work associated with this Partnership:

Shared purpose in collaborating for improved learning for all stakeholders; focusing on continuous school/system/agency improvement and student achievement.

Reciprocity whereby the school/system/agency and program provider equally benefit from having candidates and program faculty participate in the school/system/agency environment through mutually valuable opportunities such as; 1) preparation of candidates; 2) training, evaluation, and ongoing professional development for all educators; 3) research and inquiry into improving practice; 4) and, other functions as agreed upon by the school/agency and program provider.

SPS Role and Requirements SPS will:

- (i) Work with the COEHS to assign VSU students, who are enrolled in an educator preparation program for K-12 teachers profiles school professionals, to mentors that will assist in the student's diverse student learning and development.
- (2) Support leadership candidates who participate in school improvement and research partnerships with university personnel.
- (3): A saign to educator candidates or interest only mentors who are best qualified and have and have received an annual summative performance evaluation rating of proficient/satisfactory or higher for the most recent year of superiories, have a minimum of three (3) years of experience in a leaching service of leagueship role, and hold renewable professional-level certification in the contentiares of the certification sought by the educator candidate.

COEHS Role and Requirements COEHS will:

(1) Work with SPS to design and implement clinical experiences, utilizing various modalities, of sufficient depth, breadth diversity solicities, and duration to ensure and denoised demonstrate their developing effectiveness and plative impact on diverse K-12 students learning and development. Emphasis will be placed on experiences that provide active professional practice or demonstration and that qualities substantly work with K-12 students or K-12 personnel as appropriate for the areas in which the educator candidates are being prepared, unless both parties agree that the school placement should involve observation only. As agreed upon by the K-12 mentor educator and university supervisor, the mentor educator will deploy gradually increasing responsibilities to the student as the capacity to carry such responsibilities is demonstrated. The supervision of COEHS educator candidate experiences.

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in the K=19/schools will be performed cooperatively by appropriate members to the school personnel and the VSU educator preparation program personnel.

(2) Work with SPS to prepare, evaluate, and support high quality clinical reducators through training evaluation and ongoing professional development.

COEHS Students Role and Requirements

COEHS students/educator candidates will:

- (1) Present himself/herself only after a confirmation of the placement by both the K-12 personnel and COEHS Partnership Relations Specialist.
- (2) Will complete all forms required for school placement, including a background check if applicable.
- (3) Maintain COEHS-approved liability insurance for the duration of clinical experiences.
- (4) Hold a Georgia Pre-Service Certificate or other COEHS-approved certification.
- (5) Follow SPS policies, guidelines, procedures, and curriculum at all times and if not, will be withdrawn from the clinical experience.
- (6) Meet/all/attendance/requirement/set/by/SPS/and/COEHS.
- (7) Conduct themselves in a professional manner, be willing to accept professional feedback, and if not, will be withdrawn from the clinical experience.
