MINUTES OF THE MEETING COLLEGE OF EDUCATION EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The College of Education Executive Committee met on Thursday, November 12, at 8:30 a.m. in Room 235 of the Education Center with Dean Gunter presiding. Minutes from Meeting on October 22, 2009 --- Reffel

A motion to approve the minutes of October 22, 2009 was made by Leech and seconded by Bauer; with no discussion, changes or amendments, the minutes were approved.

Transition for the Interim period --- Gunter

A transition plan is being planned for the six month period for January 1-June 30 while Dean Gunter is serving as the Interim Vice President for Academic Affairs. An announcement will be forthcoming.

Graduate Credit for National Board Certification ---- Gunter, Wiley, Reffel

Dr. Wiley presented <u>a request from a doctoral student</u> to accept six hours of graduate credit from her work in the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards. Dr. Wiley would like to propose that National Board Certified Teachers' credit be considered as transfer credit graduate programs. The proposal was remanded to the Graduate Policies Committee for a recommendation to the Executive Committee.

Completers List --- Lee

Associate Dean Lee asked that each program make sure they have finalized each of completers' lists. The goal is to make sure that all completers have been captured in the data. PAAR will be finalized tomorrow, Monday, November 16, 2009 by Dean Gunter.

Report from EPAAC --- Lee/Gunter

Dean Gunter and Associate Dean Lee attended the EPAAC meeting last week. Kelly Henson said that in the proposal, teachers have to attend out of state programs that are NCATE or TEAC accredited in order to receive a pay increase. For advanced degrees from VSU, teachers receiving a Masters' degree need to have 12 hours of advanced coursework matching their initial certification; teachers receiving an Ed.S. need to have 9 hours of advanced coursework matching their initial certification. We will be sending feedback about how endorsement credit will be considered (ie. ESOL, Gifted, Reading, Online Teaching). There will be a phase in timeline for teachers currently enrolled in programs. Clarification on the Math / Science Endorsement was provided at EPAAC. Three documents were disseminated:

House Bill 280 USG Online Courses for Science and Mathematics P-5 Endorsement Program PSC Rule 505-3-.69 K-5 Science Endorsement Program

The ECSE department is planning to submit proposals for both Math and Science K-5 endorsements. If GA receives "Race to the Top" funding, a tracking system will be in place to

match student achievement with teacher preparation programs. Dean Gunter would like to propose a pilot of how this might work. The second day of EPAAC, Linda Noble, Associate Vice Chancellor presented on the concept that the BOR trying to get programs closer to 120 hours. This is in an effort to improve retention and graduate rates. Universities are getting programs sent back with recommendations to "use the core to try to get closer to 120 hours." The BOR will be establishing working groups on this for EPAAC to take action.

Report from the Assessment Committee --- Reffel

J. Reffel presented a report from the COE Assessment Committee. At a recent meeting, the committee revised the Candidate Survey for Program Improvement by moving a few questions for a better flow and dividing one question into two for clarity. At the December meeting, the committee will discuss the ESPI, GSPI, AGSPI.

J. Reffel announced that the last data meeting of the semester will be held on Thursday, December 3 to run semester reports.

Tenure and Promotion packets --- Gunter
