WHAT IS HONORS?

The Honors College offers unique courses and activities designed to help our students realize their full intellectual potential and to provide them opportunities for growth and greater understanding alongside their major degree programs.

Students have access to an exclusive residential and social community, scholarship and awards, experiential learning opportunities, and committed, involved faculty.

The Honors College encourages meaningful connections across disciplines, innovative approaches to subject matter, experiential learning, and global awareness. Completion of this interdisciplinary program leads to a Certificate of University Honors and special notation on official university transcripts.





EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING and GLOBAL EXPERIENCE

Here at the Honors College, we value experiential learning and the contributions that these opportunities make to our students' educations. Experiential learning challenges students to work outside the classroom and apply themselves through service, problem-solving and applied research. These activities can include internships, leadership, undergraduate research, or participation in one of our experiential student groups.

The Honors College offers a two-week study abroad trip to Waterford, Ireland, in collaboration with the Communication Arts department. Students spend two weeks in Ireland studying the culture and traditions of the country with a small group of peers.

HONORS OPTION

Courses not listed as Honors may also be available for Honors credit through the Honors Option Contract. These contracts provide students with the flexibility to enroll in their regular courses while completing additional assignments or projects that create a more profound learning experience. Assignments are preapproved by the instructor of the course and the Dean of the Honors College.

THE HONORS STUDENT ASSOCIATION

The Honors Student Association, commonly known as HSA, is a service and academic-oriented student group representing the Honors College, with students from every program of study. The student group hosts social events, participates in on-campus activities, provides service and leadership opportunities, and engages students in academic research. The HSA keeps students involved around campus, in the Honors College, and our local Valdosta community.









ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

High school GPA, SAT/ACT scores, an application essay, and a letter of recommendation from a teacher or academic advisor. All applicants are expected to have and maintain a minimum GPA of 3.5. Current VSU students with a 3.5 GPA or higher may apply at any time. Students are provisionally accepted during their first semester in the Honors College. After successful completion of HONS 1990 and approval of an Honors committee, students will be considered for full admittance into the Honors College and will be qualified for funding and benefits.
