Policy:	In addition to successful completion of coursework, students are required to	
	participate in the Health Education Systems Incorporated (HESI) Testing	
	Program. The HESI Testing Program includes independent review of selected	
	nursing content and completion of standardized tests. This standardized	
	assessment package will be used prior to admission and throughout the entire	
	nursing program as an academic measuring tool and as a focused remediation tool.	
	Specific standardized tests have been selected for progression in nursing and	
	require attainment of a designated score. The School of Nursing Faculty and its	
	faculty reserve the right to add new assessments when available and to require	
	remediation assignments when needed for identified student learning needs.	
	Mandatory participation by all Pre-licensure Nursing students is required for the	
	HESI Testing Program and the NCLEX-RN Review course. Students who do not	
	comply with the payment schedule will be unable to complete the	
	assignments/testing for each course and may receive an "F" for the nursing	
	course. All pre-licensure students are also required to attend an external NCLEX	
	Review course offered by the VSU School of Nursing.	
Purpose:	The testing program correlates with success in nursing by using scheduled exams	
	that are required for progression. Students are required to achieve a target score	
	(identified through psychometric analysis) on standardized tests throughout the	
	nursing curriculum. Scores are identified through psychometric analysis as	
	consistent with success in nursing and reflect VSU School of Nursing's academic	
	standards for student performance. As data on test performance is developed	
	and as the benchmarks for academic achievement in the nursing program	
	advance, scores may change. The actual score is also dependent upon which	
	version of the test is administered. Students may request information regarding	
	the required score for each test administered by contacting the School of Nursing	
	Administrative office.	
Procedure:	HESI Admission Assessment (A2) Exam	
	As part of the competitive admissions process for the BSN traditional and BSN	
	accelerated programs, the HESI A2 Exam is an <u>admission requirement</u> for all applicants. The student is responsible for ensuring the results of the HESI A2 exam	
	have been received by the School of Nursing by the application deadline.	
	All applicants must complete these designated sections: Math, Reading	
	Comprehension, Vocabulary and General Knowledge, Grammar, Anatomy	

- & Physiology, Learning Style, Personality Profile, and Critical Thinking (pre- & post-program). The Undergraduate nursing program utilizes the results of the HESI A2 exam in a manner to meet the needs of each specific program. The benchmark for the exam in our program is a 75 in each of the following areas: Math, Reading Comprehension, Vocabulary and General Knowledge, Grammar, and Anatomy & Physiology.
- 2. Applicants have two (2) attempts to complete the HESI A2 Exam within an application cycle, with the highest score used for program selection. The scores are valid for one (1) year post examination date.

HESI Specialty Exams

HESI exams will be administered in each semester throughout the program.

- Students will take one or two HESI exams during each semester. The
 exam will be scheduled by the instructor. The HESI exam 1 will be
 scheduled at midterm. The HESI exam 2 will be scheduled at the end of
 the semester.

- 3. The HESI Exit exam will be given in the senior 2 course NURS 4224.
- 4. The benchmark score for each exam is 850.
- 5. The conversion score for the HESI exam 2 specialty exam will be recorded as 5% of the total course grade.
- 6. If the student does not achieve 850 or better on the first HESI exam, he/she will be required to spend <u>a minimum amount of time</u> in HESI remediation.

- 7. The HESI exam 1 results will direct the remediation plan. Begin remediation with Essential Packets first.
- Remediation must be focused on areas of greatest weakness.
- STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO COMPLETE REMEDIATION PRIOR TO HESI EXAM 2. This will be the students "ticket to test" for the HESI exam 2 attempt.
- Any work completed prior to the HESI exam 1 <u>DOES NOT</u> count toward remediation time.

8. If the student does not meet the benchmark of 850 on the second HESI, the instructor will provide written referral to the SPARC Director for further remediation.

HESI Exit Exam

- 1. Students will take HESI EXIT EXAM twice during the capstone course (NURS 4224).
- 2. If the student does not achieve 850 or better on the first HESI exam, he/she will be required to spend a <u>minimum amount of time</u> in HESI remediation.
