# Handout for History Majors who want to become Teachers in Georgia

<u>UPPER-LEVEL HISTORY COURSES</u> The following are <u>strongly recommended</u> as part of the <u>Eight</u> Upper-level History <u>Content</u> Courses:

**Georgia History**: either HIST 4211 or HIST 4212 (<u>mandatory in state of GA</u>) **Modern U.S. History**: (possible examples: HIST 4204, 4205, 4206, 4208)

VSU's College of Education also encourages History teachers to take @ least one Upper-level History course in "US Social/Cultural/Constitutional History," & highly recommends @ least one Upper-level History course in "US Colonial to WWII History."

#### MINOR AND/OR ELECTIVES

For a Teaching career, it is <u>strongly recommended</u> that History Majors take courses in Economics, Geography, Political Science, Anthropology, or Sociology.

#### **INDUCTION EDUCATIONAL CERTIFICATION in Georgia**

The agency that oversees Georgia's certification process is the **Georgia Professional Standards Commission [GaPSC]** <u>http://www.gapsc.com/</u>

Graduate w/ **GPA of 2.5** [minimum requirement, May 2016] [http://www.gapsc.com/Certification/TieredCertification/induction.aspx

Pass **GACE Program Admission Exam**, or <u>exempt</u> with scores of **SAT** - 1000 (Math + Reading); **ACT** - 43 (Math + English); or **GRE** (on or after August 1, 2011) 297 (Verbal & Quantitative). Pass GACE Content Assessment Exams in US History <u>and</u> in World History during Senior Year (see below).

See VSU's Career Opportunities Office for <u>Education Career Day</u> in fall and in spring (<u>http://www.valdosta.edu/career/</u>).

Apply for teaching jobs (<u>http://www.teachgeorgia.org/</u>) and if successful, work w/ your principal on the best path to attain certification. One option is various programs offered by VSU's College of Education & Human Services (see below). #### GACE - Georgia Assessments for the Certification of Educators

The Georgia Assessments for the Certification of Educators (GACE) ensures that candidates have the knowledge & skills needed to perform as an educator in Georgia's public schools. VSU's Office of Testing administers the GACE only during designated periods <u>http://www.valdosta.edu/academics/services/testing/undergraduate-examinations.php#GACE</u>. See <u>http://gace.ets.org/</u> for information regarding registration for exam in US History (**034**), in World History (**035**), or the Combined Exam (**534**). In addition to the <u>study materials</u> provided <u>http://gace.ets.org/prepare/materials/534</u>, see <u>https://www.georgiastandards.org/Standards/Pages/BrowseStandards/SocialStudiesStandards/9-12.aspx</u> for GA's curriculum in US History & in World History [Georgia Standards of Excellence/GSE; formally GA Performance Standards/GPS]. The GSEs can be used as <u>study guides</u> for the GACE Content exams b/c the GACE Content exams are aligned

to the curriculum. See <u>https://voicethread.com/#q.b4850045.i0.k0</u> to **help History majors sign up** for GACE -- do not answer that you are part of a teacher prep program or you will get stopped when trying to take the content part; <u>you select: "Not Listed."</u>

### <u>Preparing for the various Educational Certification Programs offered in Valdosta</u> <u>State's Dewar College of Education & Human Services (COEHS)</u>

Observe public school classrooms by working as a substitute teacher or by taking EDUC 2110, 2120, or 2130 which require field experience. The EDUC courses are <u>not</u> required for admission, but enrolling may <u>help</u> you make your career decision.

## What you need to get started:

- **Pass** GACE Program Admission Exam (or exempt see above) and GACE Content Exams in US History <u>&</u> in World History.
- Apply for a teaching job: <u>http://www.teachgeorgia.org/home.aspx</u>
- When hired, your school system will ask the **GaPSC** for a non-renewable provisional certificate [Induction Pathway 4] for you (*good for 3 years*).

**To Change** the provisional certificate to a <u>Clear Renewable Certificate (T-4 or T-5)</u>

- Bachelor's Degree in History with 2.75 GPA to enter VSU's Certification Programs.
- <u>Start</u> with a Transcript evaluation <u>http://www.valdosta.edu/colleges/education/deans-office/documents/certification-evaluation-request-form-june-2014.pdf</u>
- Upon receiving the transcript evaluation, meet with an advisor in the College of Education & Human Services to determine a timeline for entering a specific program.
- Apply to VSU's Graduate School (see <u>http://www.valdosta.edu/gradschool/</u> for online application) <u>and</u> take either GRE (Graduate Record Exam; minimum score = 143 Verbal & 138 Quantitative) or the MAT (Miller's Analogy Test; minimum score = 375). <u>Application deadlines</u> = <u>April 15 for June cohort; Nov. 15 for January cohort</u>.
- There are TWO <u>tracks</u> leading to certification: <u>http://www.valdosta.edu/colleges/education/middle-secondary-reading-and-deaf-education/secondary-education/mat-middle-grades-or-secondary-education.php</u>
  (1) For <u>working teachers</u>: <u>Certification Only</u> (21 hours over 3 semesters + SPEC
  3000) for clear renewable T-4 certificate:

2 classes in summer term

2 classes in fall term (including first teaching internship)

2 classes in spring term (including second teaching internship)

An <u>additional</u> 15 hours will complete a master's degree in Education & T-5 certification (a T-5 = certificate for a teacher with a master's degree). <u>Also consider</u> <u>the M.A. in Historical Content for Teachers offered by the History Dept.;</u> <u>contact Dr. Dixie Haggard for more information at (229-333-5947) or</u> <u>drhaggard@valdosta.edu.</u>

(2) For <u>full time students</u>: **MAT degree** & T-5 certificate (36 hours over <u>4-semesters</u>) -- if start in June = summer/fall/spring/summer semesters

-- if start in January = spring/summer/fall/spring semesters
