Dr. Nathan Willingham (DPA, 2024)

Nathan Willingham, DPA ('24), AICP, Managing Principal of Slaughter & Willingham, PLLC, has been appointed to the Mississippi R-STEP (Reliable Energy Siting through Technical Engagement & Planning) Technical Assistance Advisory Board. The Board supports the U.S. Department of Energy-funded R-STEP program, which strengthens state and local government capacity to plan, site, and permit large-scale renewable energy projects in a manner consistent with local land-use goals and community priorities.

Dr. Willingham's appointment builds directly on applied research and engagement pioneered by Dr. Keith Lee through the Center for South Georgia Regional Impact at Valdosta State University, which translates academic research into practical, locally usable tools. This approach closely aligns with R-STEP's mission to deliver fact-based education, defensible permitting frameworks, and transparent community engagement strategies for renewable energy development.

Dr. Willingham will contribute expertise in comprehensive planning, land-use regulation, and local government administration to provide local governments with tools and a playbook to address questions related to these important developments. His professional work includes ongoing comprehensive planning, ordinance development, and regulatory support for local governments navigating growth pressures, infrastructure investment, and emerging energy markets.

Liz Haley (MPA, 2025)



Elizabeth (Liz) Haley is an MPA student that recently graduated in December 2025 and worked as a graduate assistant for the program during her studies.

On November 6, 2025, she presented two of her papers at the Georgia Political Science Association (GPSA) Conference in St. Simons, Georgia at the Sea Palms Resort. Liz presented her undergrad EU Capstone paper "The Rise and Impact of Right-Wing Populism in Hungary" during the European Studies Panel. Liz previously earned 2nd place for the 2025 VSU David W. Winder Best Undergraduate Paper Award for the Department of Political Science and 2nd place for the best paper across the university at the 2025 VSU Undergraduate Research Symposium for this paper. She also presented her paper "Children of War, Agents of Peace: Assessing the UN's Response to Child Soldiers in Sierra Leone," a 54-page, 12,000 word paper (without references) that was research and compiled over 8 months. Liz chose this topic while researching the Republic of Sierra Leone in preparation to represent them at the National Model United Nations (NMUN) NYC Conference in April, 2025.

Liz currently serves as the President of the Valdosta Model United Nations (VMUN) team at VSU for the Fall 2025 semester. The following day after GPSA, Liz traveled to Washington to participate at the NMUN DC Conference in November 7-9, 2025, where she represented the Kingdom of Sweden in the International Atomic Energy Agency. VMUN earned the Outstanding Delegation Award representing the Kingdom of Sweden, a first-place award given to the top 5% of universities in attendance. This was only the second time in VMUN history at VSU, with the first being last years 2024 NMUN DC Conference when Liz served as the Vice President for the program.

Liz also traveled to Banff, Canada to participate at the NMUN International Conference in November 24-28, 2025, where she represented the Russian Federation in the UN Environment Assembly as the Head Delegate of Russia.

Michael Conger **(MPA, 2024)**

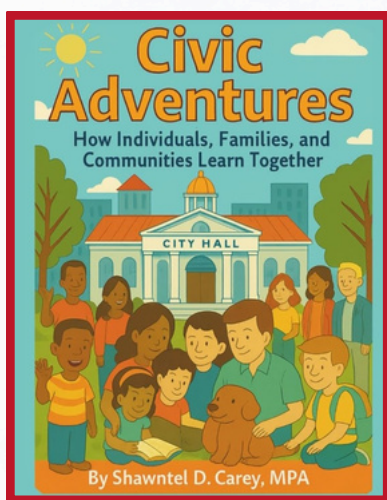

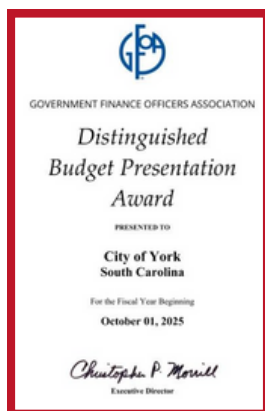
