#### PNM BILL OF RIGHTS

#### THESE ARE THINGS YOU ARE ENTITLED TO DURING RECRUITMENT:

- The right to be treated as an individual
- The right to be fully informed about the recruitment process
- The right to ask questions and receive true and objective answers from recruitment counselors and members
- The right to be treated with respect
- The right to be treated as a capable and mature person without being patronized
- The right to ask how and why and receive straight answers
- The right to have and express opinions to recruitment counselors
- The right to have inviolable confidentiality when sharing information with recruitment counselors
- The right to make informed choices without undue pressure from others
- The right to be fully informed about the NPC Unanimous Agreements implicit in the membership recruitment acceptance binding agreement (MRABA) signing process
- The right to make one's own choice and decision and accept full responsibility for the results of that decision
- The right to have a positive, safe and enriching recruitment and new member experience

#### FINANCIAL INFORMATION

#### HOW MUCH WILL THIS COST?

Financial requirements are a key consideration for women joining a sorority, so it is essential to be well-informed about the costs associated with the sorority experience. If you accept an invitation to join a chapter, you will enter into a financial agreement for dues throughout your college years. These dues and fees vary between chapters and from year to year. Sorority costs will be higher during the first year due to one-time new member fees and expenses. All sororities on campus offer payment plans to help members manage their financial obligations. There are also many optional "extras" that are not mandatory for members. During Sisterhood day, each chapter will present detailed information about their specific dues. Be sure to ask the chapter or your Gamma Chi any questions you have about finances.

#### WHAT TO EXPECT: ROUND ONE

#### PHILANTHROPY DAY

During philanthropy day, you'll meet all six chapters active on campus. chapters will share their community activities and impact. They will likely ask what you seek in a sorority, so be ready to engage. Consider asking questions such as: What do you do for your philanthropy? What does your philanthropy mean to you? Why did you choose your chapter? Additionally, you can discuss scholarship and your academic achievements.

Each round will start with loud cheering and chanting, but don't let the noise intimidate you, the chapters are excited to meet you!

#### Outfit suggestions:

You'll wear the shirt provided by Panhellenic with any bottoms of your choosing. Remember this will be a long day, so wear something you're comfortable in and don't mind wearing all day!









#### WHAT TO EXPECT: ROUND TWO

#### SISTERHOOD DAY

During Sisterhood day, you'll visit a maximum of four chapters. Chapter women will want to know how you would fit into their sisterhood, so they may ask questions related to your values, goals, and what you're looking for in a sorority. You will see a video from each chapter that reflects their sisterhood and what they value in their members. This round will focus on building meaningful connections between you and the chapter members. Chapters will also present financial obligations during this round. Be sure to ask any questions you may have regarding the financial aspect of sorority membership. You'll be able to take the financial transparency sheet out of the recruitment room when you leave.

#### Outfit suggestions:

Rompers, jumpsuits, sundresses, or something similar. You should dress up a little more than the previous day, but still be comfortable.









#### WHAT TO EXPECT: ROUND THREE

#### **PREFERENCE DAY**

During Preference day, you'll visit a maximum of two chapters. This is the most serious round of recruitment. This round should help you make your final decision by the end of rounds. During each ceremony, think about how you feel with each chapter and take time to picture yourself as a member. These women could become your sisters! Each chapter will present a Preference Ceremony which usually contains songs or speeches from members. Listen carefully to what each chapter has to say, and make your decision based on how YOUR experience has been with the chapters. You will make your final decision at the end of this round.

#### Outfit suggestions:

Preference round is dressier than the other rounds of recruitment. Chapter members will be wearing "Pin Wear" which is comparable to wedding or interview attire. Wear something that makes you feel comfortable and confident!









#### WHAT TO EXPECT: ROUND FOUR

#### **BID DAY**

Bid day is the BEST day of the year! On this day, you may receive an invitation to join a chapter you visited during Preference Day. You will meet your Gamma Chi on campus in the morning, then meet your new chapter on the Front Lawn before attending a Bid Day event hosted by that chapter. If you are not matched to a sorority on Bid Day, your Gamma Chi will provide you with the options that are available to you at that time.

#### Outfit suggestions:

Wear the shirt you were given for Philanthropy day to meet your Gamma Chi and comfortable shorts and shoes of your choice. We suggest you wear a sports bra or tank top under your shirt because you will be changing into a new shirt given to you by your new sorority.

#### Social:

- What are some of your social functions?
- Is it mandatory to attend all social functions?
- Is there anyone in your chapter from my area or high school that I might know?

#### Sisterhood:

- What sisterhood activities does the chapter plan?
- Do the members spend time together outside meetings and mandatory events?
- What makes your chapter's sisterhood strong?
- How well did you get to know everyone in the chapter?

#### **Activities:**

- How active is your chapter in intramurals?
- Are your members involved in academic groups or campus?
- What philanthropies do you support?
- How involved is your sorority in other campus activities?
- Do you help support other chapter's philanthropies?

- Are alumnae actively involved in your chapter?

#### Leadership:

- What leadership opportunities are available?
- Are there positions I can hold as a new member?
- How will this position help me outside of sorority life?

#### Personal:

- Why did you choose this sorority?
- How were you sure it was the right choice for you?
- How has being a member of this sorority benefited you?
